Vienna, April 16:

THe 19 instant is appointed for the celebrating the Funerals of the late Empress, when the Emperor will come to Town and receive the Compliment of Condo- lence from the respective Forreign Mi- nisters residing at this Court; immediately after which is done, the Emperor will return to *Laxemburgh*, with intentions as is said, to continue there most part of the Summer. In *Hungary* the Rebels begin to show their Heads again, having lately as they give out, received a very large summe of Money from the Port, and besides being encouraged by the general dissatis- faction they find amongst all the Gentry and Nobility of the Kingdom, occasioned by the rigorous pro- ceedings of the Imperial Ministers there; this news has not onely made the Emperor revoke the Orders he had sent to General *Cops*, who Commands in chief the Imperial Forces in that Kingdom, to return home, but at the same time to resolve to send him a farther Force for the security of the Peace of those Countreys; and in the interim directions have as we are told, been sent to the Grand Master of the Teutonick Order, now Vice-Roy of *Hungary*, to return home, it being found that his presence there has in some manner prejudiced the Emperors Service. The Sieur *Crahow*, Envoy from the Elector of *Brandenburgh*, hath been here some time, though we cannot yet hear that he hath suc- ceeded in the business he came about. We are told of preparations that are making against the approaching Campagne, and that it was lately resolved in a Council of War, where General *Montecuculi* was present, that the Forces now Commanded by the Duke of *Bour- nonville* in the Empire, shall be recruited and made up 30000 Men Horse and Foot. Here are already several discourses concerning the Emperors Marrying again.

Ratisbonne, April 24. After many difficulties the Dyet hath at length concluded the matter concerning the Mediation, and accordingly have nominated the persons who are to be employed in it, who are in their Instructions to be particularly charged, to be careful of the Interest of the Empire; Their next work will be to resolve and agree to what hath been proposed by some of the Deputies, for the bringing the Forces of the several Circles, forthwith on foot, in order to which, the Prince of *Baden Dourlach*, together with the other chief Officers of the Army, are expected here. Several Princes of the Empire continue to raise Men in all these parts.

Hamburg, May 1. We see Souldiers pass daily to- wards *Bremeu*, who come from *Pomeren*, and have been Landed there from *Sweden*, besides the new Leavies the *Swedes* have been making all this Spring in these parts: General *Wrangel* who is to Command the Force they are now bringing together, is not as yet arrived on this side of the water, but daily expected, though some report, that he will not come till *August* next. The Elector of *Brandenburgh* is still at *Berlin*, and as is said, is very busie about reinforcing his Troops. We have not any thing of news from the *Rhyn*, there having not of late passed any remarkable Action; Monsieur *de Turenne* lyes still at *Saest* in the

County vander *Mark*. And the Bishop of *Munsters* Troops are most marched back towards *Westphalia*.

Cologne, May 2. From *Lipstads* of the 29 past our Letters tell us, that the Sieur *Straceman* Vice-Chan- celor of the Duke of *Newburgh*, had passed through that place on his way to *Berlin*. From *Munster* they write, that *Couerden* is blocked up by their Troops, and that they hoped to make themselves masters of the place, From *Erfort* of the 24 past, that the Imperial Army lies still quartered thereabouts, being in all 15000 Men, Horse and Foot, but that it was reported that they would suddainly break up, and march towards *Bohemia*. The Marquis *de Grana* has received his last and positive Orders from the Court at *Vienna*, to re- pair immediately thither. The 30 past arrived here the Count *de la Garde*, Ambassador from the Crown of *Sweden*, from *Francfort*, and this day went hence for *Duseldorp*. From *Baden* in *Swisserland* we have advice, that there was at present an Extraordinary Assembly there of all the Cantons, and that there were Amba- sadors from the Emperor, *France*, and *Spain*. The Gov- ernor of *Brisac* hath received Orders, as we are told, to release the Vessels he caused to be stopped as they were going to *Strasburgh*. Monsieur *de Turenne* continues still at *Saest*; the French Troops in the mean time pass daily down the *Rhyne* towards the Conquered places.

Maestrict, May 3. Since what we told you, happen- ed on Friday last, we have not seen any Enemy, those that appeared then, were, as we understood since, some Troops of Cavalry that were passing towards *Flanders*, to be at the general Rendezvous appointed about the middle of this month: Our advices continue still to tell us, that we must expect to see the most Christi- an King ere this month's ended with a powerful Army under our Walls, and accordingly we are making all the preparations we are able for our defence.

Wrecht, May 2. Yesterday arrived here the Prince of *Conde*, together with the Duke *d' Enguyen* his Son, and a Train of about 30 Persons onely from *Nimme- gen*; since he hath visited our Fortifications, and hath given Orders for the hastening all our preparations, we cannot yet learn what particular design this Prince has in hand, though all certainly conclude, that he will suddenly attempt something considerable. On Sunday last marched hence 600 Horse with 12 Wagons, laden with Ammunition and other Military Provisions towards *Overyssel*. We are told of a Rencontre that hath happened between four Companies that were going from hence to *Woerden*, and a party of Dutch.

Hague, May 3. Yesterday the Swedish Ambassadors had their last Audience of the States-General, whither they were conducted by the Sieurs *Crommon* and *Boots- ma*, deputed to that purpose, with the usual Ceremo- nies; to morrow or next day their Excellencies will be- gin their journey from hence, as our Plenipotentiaries intend to do on Saturday next at farthest, for *Aix la Chapelle*, where the Treaty is appointed to be, To morrow or next day his Highness the Prince of *Orange* is expected back here from *Schonehovet*, and those other places he hath been to visit; In the mean time Count *Waldeck* continues here, Prince *Mauritz* is gone for *Frisland*
