Stockholm, Dec. 19. Yesterday Morning Count Horn produced in the Senate a Memorial to desire his Dismission from his Post of Senator and President of the Chancery, which was agreed to, and sent by the Secretary of State Cederstrom, with an Extract of the Protocol of the Senate to the States, who have all consented to it, and it was proposed in that of the Nobility, that as Count Horn had served so long with Fidelity and Integrity, his Excellency should retain as long as he lives the Emoluments of both his Employments; which Proposal was agreed to by all the States, Nemine contradicente: His Excellency took his Leave this Morning both of the Senate and the Chancery.

Hambourg, Jan. 6, N. S. There has fallen such a prodigious Quantity of Snow for these 48 Hours past, that the Roads are impracticable, *passable*.

Vienna, Jan. 1, N. S. This Court has Letters of the 28th past from the Duke and Dutchess of Lorraine, dated at a Village near Verona, where the Venetians exact a rigorous Quarantain, for instead of the 21 Days that were promised, the Republick have extended them to 29.

Berlin, Jan. 10, N. S. We have here most favourable Accounts with Regard to the Abatement of the Plague, both on the Side of Poland and Hungary; and Lieutenant General Botta, who passed through this Place a few Days ago in his Way from Vienna to Petersbourg, has confirmed the Security we live in here, as to Hungary, where he assures us that the Number of the Sick is now so few, that (with the Blessing of God) all Apprehensions from that Quarter will soon be entirely over. The State of his Prussian Majesty's Health continues to be the principal Object of our Attention here: There is yet

no Amendment, and according to the Accounts we have here to Day, his Prussian Majesty rested very ill last Night.

Hague, Jan. 16, N. S. The States of Holland have now employed two Days in deliberating upon the Application they have laying before them from Count Uhlesfeldt, for their lending the Emperor, his Master, Six Millions of Florins; but it is not yet known if they are come to any Decision thereupon. Last Tuesday Night James Dayrolle, Esq; his Britannick Majesty's Resident to the States General, died here, in the 83d Year of his Age.

Bank, 14 December, 1738.

Upon a Representation from His Majesty's Postmaster-General, That it is apprehended that the Expectation of finding Bank Bills in the Letters, gives Encouragement to the frequent Robbery of the Mails; The Bank of England, to contribute what in them lies to put a Stop thereto, and to render their Bills of no Significancy or Value to those who are guilty of such flagitious Practices, do declare, That for the Benefit and Security of those who have Occasion to transact Money Affairs in the Country, they will from and after the First Day of January next (instead of Three Days Sight Bills) give to such as desire the same, their Bills payable at Seven Days after Sight to ——— or Order, whereby in Case of a Robbery, the Proprietors will have Time to give Notice thereof; and if the Indorsements are duly filled up, as they expect they should, they can be of no Use or Service but to the right Owners.

And whereas they may fall into those Hands who may be ignorant of the Form of indorsing them, a Blank Indorsement will be printed on the Back for the Parties to fill up, and to be repeated as often as Occasion requires.

South Sea House, London, Jan. 12, 1738.
