HE Great General of Poland has writ Word, that he fent an Officer to the Seraskier of the Turkish Army at Bender to claim the Poles that were taken Prifoners the last Campaign, and that the Selaskier answered, that all the Poles among his Prifoners thould be immediately delivered : But he imagined that most of the Polifh Priloners were among the Tartars; lo the Officer, according to his Inftructions, continued his Journey to Conftanti-nople, where the Kam is at prefent, and in great Dilgrace, as we are informed here. The last Letters from Kioff advise, that Pierrejelley, a little Town built by the Czar Peter the Great, below Kioff, on the opposite Banks of the Borysthenes, has lost every one of its Inhabitants by the Plague. The same Letters mention, that Lieutenant General Lewendahl has left Kioff, to go and com-mand in the Lines of the Ukraine. Our Advices concerning the Plague in this Country continue very favourable, excepting in one Let-ter it's faid, that in a Village in Podolia eleven People were carried off by it in one Night. Vienna, Feb. 214 N. S. There is Advice from the Bannat, that a Body of the Rebels, intermixed with Turks and Tartars, to the Number of about 3000, were come down from the Mountains called the Almas, to ravage the Country. It is faid that fome Regiments of Horse are ordered to be drawn out of their Quarters, and to be ready to form a Body in the Bannat by the 15th of next Month. Nothing has been declared yet with respect to the Command of the Army; but the general Opinion continues in Favour of Marshal Wallis.

Upon a Reprefentation from His Majefty's Poltmaster-General, That is is apprehended that the Empettation of finding Bank Bills in the Letters, gives Encouragement to the frequent Robbery of the Mails; The Bank of England, to constribute what in them lies to put a Stop thereto, and to render their Bills of no Significancy or Value to those who are guilty of fuch flagitious Prattices, do declare, That for the Benefit and Security of those who have Occasion to transalt Money Affairs in the Country, they will from and after the First Day of January next (instead of Three Days Sight Bills) give to such as defire the fame, their Bills payable at Seven Days after Sight to or Order, whereby in Case of a Robbery, the Proprietors will have Time to give Notice thereof; and if the Indorfements are duly filled up, as they expect they fhould, they can be of the Use or Service but to the right Owners,
