**T**HE 11th Instant Felt Marshal Munich arrived here, and the 13th his Niece Mademoiselle Wildeman, the Czarina's first Maid of Honour, was married in the Great Hall of the Palace, in her Majesty's Presence, to Baron Mengden, Vice President of the College of Justice

*Warsaw, March 7, N. S.* The 5th Instant the Court received a Courier from Count Wackerbath at Rome, with the joyful News of the Queen of the Two Sicilies having got over the critical Day of her Distemper, and of her Majesty's being out of all Danger.

*Vienna, March 11.* The Empress was a good deal disorder'd on Sunday last, after having given Audience to the French Ambassadour and others, but was well enough last Night to give an Audience to the French Ambassadors. The Command in chief of the Army has been consign'd in Form to Marshal Wallis ad interim, and it is thought his Departure from hence will be hasten'd, a Party of Turks having already appear'd in the Neighbourhood of Sabatz, in order, as is supposed, to learn what Condition that Place is in, or rather, as it is thought by some, to draw

the Attention of the Imperialists thither, while their real Design may be to make an early Attempt from out of Bosnja upon Ratscha. On the 4th Instant the Emperour made the following Promotion of General Officers, viz. Generals of Horse, Styrum, Prince Lichtenstein, Budiani. Lieutenants General of Horse, St. Ignon, Palfy, Bernes. Majors General of Horse, Kohary, Taff, Holli, Prince de Hesse, d'Ollone, Prince de Birckenfeld. Lieutenants General of Foot, Molck, Daun; Prince de Salm. Majors General of Foot, Helderisch, Busch, Prince de Hildburgshausen, Berenclau.
