HE 11th Inftant Felt Marshal Munich arrived here, and the 13th his Niece Madamoifelle Wildeman, the Czarina's first Maid of Honour, was married in the Great Hall of the Palace, in her Majesty's Prefence, to Baron Mengden, Vice Pretident of the College of Justice

Warfaw, March 7, N.S. The 5th Inftant the Court received a Courier from Count Wackerbath at Rome, with the joyful News of the Queen of the Two Sicilies having got over the critical Day of her Diftemper, and of her Majefty's being out of all Danger.

Vienna, March II. The Empress was a good deal diforder'd on Sunday last, after having given Audience to the French Ambassiadour and others, but was well enough last Night to give an Audience to the French Ambassiadress. The Command in chief of the Army has been confign'd in Form to Marshal Wallis ad interim, and it is thought his Departure from hence will be hastened, a Party of Turks having already appear'd in the Neighbourhood of Sabatz, in order, as is supposed, to learn what Condition that Place is in, or rather, as it is thought by fome, to draw

the Attention of the Imperialists thither, while their real Design may be to make an early Attempt from out of Bosnia upon Ratscha. On the 4th Instant the Emperour made the following Promotion of General Officers, viz. Generals of Horse, Styrum, Prince Lichtenstein, Budiani. Lieutenants General of Horse, St. Ignon, Palfy, Bernes. Majors General of Horse, Kohary, Taff, Holli, Prince de Hesse, d'Ollone, Prince de Birckenseld. Lieutenants General of Foot, Molck, Daun; Prince de Salm. Majors General of Foot, Helferisch, Busch, Prince de, Hildburgschaufen, Berenclau.

Bank, 14 December, 1738.
