Petersbourg, March 10.

FELT Marshal Munich set out the 7th Instant in order to return to the Army he commands in the Ukraine. Lieutenant General Biron, the Duke of Courland's eldest Brother, who had asked his Discharge, is also gone back to that Army, after having received a Present of Ten thousand Roubles from the Czarina.

Naples, March, 17, N. S. On the 11th arrived here from Florence M. de Kinigle, who on the 14th had a private Audience of the King and Queen, in which he acquainted their Majesties with the Arrival of the Great Duke and Dutchess in Tuscany. On the 12th an Order was sent by the King to the City, and Governours of the Castles, for a general Illumination for three Nights successively, on the Publication of the Marriage between the Infante Don Philip, and the eldest Princess of France. On the 13th his Majesty returned to this City from the Villa of Portici, when the Court and Nobility appeared in great Splendour to compliment the Queen on her Recovery. On the 14th their Majesties assisted at the Te Deum, which was sung on that Occasion at the Cathedral Church, when the Guns of the Castles were fired, and Illuminations made throughout the City. On the 15th their Majesties set out for the Villa of Portici.

Leghorn, March 27. On the 23d sailed from hence for Port Mahon and the Streights, his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dragon, Captain Barnet Commander. The same Day five Companies out of the Imperial Regiment Pallavicini (Foot) marched hence for Hungary.

Florence, March 30. On the 24th M. Solari arrived here from Turin, to compliment the Great Duke and Dutchess on the Part of the King of Sardinia. On the 25th he notified his Arrival to the Court, when a Gentleman of his Royal Highness's Household was ordered to attend and conduct him from his Lodging to the Apartment purposely prepared for him, where according to the new Regulation and Ceremonial of this Court, foreign Ministers are to be entertained at the Expence of the Great Duke. On the 26th he had a private Audience of the Great Duke and Dutchess, as he had the next Day of Prince Charles of Lorraine, and the Electress Dowager Palatine. On the 26th the Marquess Riccardi returned hither from Rome, as did M. de Kinigle from Naples, after having executed the Commissions of the Great Duke at those Courts. The same Evening a Courier was dispatch'd by the Great Duke to the Court of Vienna. On the 28th, the Duke Don Philip Corsini arrived here from

Rome, to pay his Homage to the Great Duke, and has at the same Time a Commission to settle on the Part of the Court of Rome the Ceremonial and Reception of M. Stoppani, the Pope's Nuncio at this Court. During the Holy Week there has been no Court, their Royal Highnesses have assisted at all the publick Functions in the Churches, and on Good Friday, according to Custom, visited on Foot seven Churches. This Morning the Great Duke and Dutchess, attended by their Great Officers, went in State to the Cathedral Church, and afterwards the Electress Dowager Palatine dined with them in publick.
