Whitehall, April 11.

A BOUT Nine a-Clock this Evening, the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Oxford, Rector of St. James's Westminster, performed the Ceremony of Baptizing, by the Name of Edward Augustus, the young Prince, Second Son of their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales. The Godfathers were, the King of Prussia represented by his Grace the Duke of Queensberry; the Duke of Brunswick Wolfenbuttel represented by the Marquess of Caernarvon: And the Godmother was the Dutchess of Saxe-Weissenfels represented by the Lady Charlotte Edwin. His Royal Highness the Prince was present, as was her Royal Highness sitting on a Bed of State, the Lords and Ladies of their Bed-chambers attending.

Berlin, April 7, N. S. Since Felt Marshal Gromkow's Death, M. Bodt, one of the King of Prussia's private Secretaries, has been made Minister of State; and he is to come into M. Gorne's Department, who is to be removed to that which the late M. Gromkow had at the Grand Directoire. On Sunday Morning last died here M. Viebahn, one of his Prussian Majesty's Ministers of State for Civil and Criminal Affairs. He had been several Times employ'd as Minister to the Court of Poland, and lately was one of the Commissaries appointed to treat at Baruth with those of Saxony, upon the Differences between the two Courts relating to Commerce and other Matters. His Prussian Majesty finds himself something better since last Friday; and is able to take the Air on Horseback.

Vienna, April 8, N. S. It begins now to be generally assured, that the Great Duke will be here about the End of next Month. The Troops from the Empire arrive slowly. In one Body of Wurtembergers, which was to have consisted of 1100 Men, there were wanting near 300, when they pass'd by this Place.

Hambourg, April 10, N. S. Her Royal Highness the Princess of Wales's youngest Brother, Prince John Adolph of Saxe Gotha, arrived here on the 7th Instant from Geneva. His Highness intends to set out in a few Days for Copenhagen.

Copenhagen, April 11, N. S. The King of Denmark has given the Order of Dannbrogg to the Son of Count Stolberg, with an Intimation that it soon shall be followed by that of the Elephant; it being usual for those

who are to have the Blue-Ribbon, to wear the White one first.

Berlin, April 14, N. S. Lieutenant-General Goltz, Commandant of Magdebourg, is lately dead. His Regiment of Foot has been given to Col. Weddel, and his Post at Magdebourg to Lieutenant General Gravepitz. The Regiment late M. Gromkow's, has not yet been disposed of.
