Oftend, May 17. Veffel arrived here this Morning, the Mafter tells us, That he passed through the Dutch Flect yesterclay in the Evening, That they then lay at Ankor at Schonevelt, up-on the Coalt of Zealand, being in all about 45 men of War, That he was on board fome or them, and found them very weakly Manned.

Rome, April 22. On Monday lait was held a Confiltory, where his Holinefs was likewife prefent, we had expected there would have been made a promotion of carcinals, but all that was done, was the confir-mation of Cardinal Altiers Legat of Urbin, Cardinal Bonavos fi Legat of Bologne, and the Cardinal Chigi Legat of Ferrara, however it is thought, the faid Promotion will not be deferred much longer, becaufe of the great decay of ftrength in his Holineis, who hath lately been troubled with feveral fits of the Gout, and much weakened by it. We continue to difcourfe of the Marriage between Don Frederice Sforza, and Dona Livia Celurini, though there be fome of great Authority that ceafe not still to oppose it. In Thursday last was performed the Ceremony of investing the Prince Savelli, and the Prince Palejlyina, with the Order of the Golden Fleere. Signior Rocci is to be made Vice-Legat of Urbin. The Minister refiding here on the part of the Crown of Poland, hath lately acquainted his Holinefs, that the affairs of that kingdom are at prefent in a better condition, then they have been for these feveral years path, by reason of the accommodation of all their differences at home; yet notwithstanding that their Militia cannot be fo foon in a posture to defend them against the great force of the Turks, which threatens them with an Invasion this Summer, unlefs they receive affiltance from other, Christian Princes their neighbors, and therefore address themselves particularly to his Holiness for his; who, we are told, hath declared ro, the faid Envoy, that he will contribute all he can towards sheir defence and prefervation.

Venice, April 29. We have here but little news, fave what we received by feveral Veffels arrived from Constantinople, by whom we learn, that the Grand Signior cominues still at Adrianople, whils the Grand Vizier omits no care or diligence for carrying on the preparations of War, which are faid to be very great all over that Empire; that the difcourfe generally is of a War with *Polund*, becaufe of that Crowns retuling to pay the Tribute, they are obliged by the late Treaty, to do annually. The Christian Gallies are still very busy in the Ar hipelago, and now play every where the Mafters; the Turks not having any force at Sea, that we can hear of. Our Duke, notwith landing his great age continues in perfect health.

Genoua, May 3. This States Convoy is now ready to depart with 5 or 6 confiderable Merchant Men for Czdiz. This Senate hath refolved to fend an Envoy to the most Christian King, to return his Majesty their thanks for his effectual Mediation in the reeltablishing of Perce between them and the Duke of Sivor. We have already disbanded greatest part of our Troops; This State refolving to keep in their fervice a Body of

5 or 6000 Men onely. From Milan the y write, that the difference between their Governor the Duke d' Offuna, and their Archbishop, the Cardinal Litta, is now perfectly reconciled, by the interpolition of the Pope, fo that frequent visits pass between them, to the great fa-tisfaction of that Court. That there lately passed a Courier through that place from Spain, being fent to the Governor of the Franche Comte, with Bills of Exchange for a very confiderable fum of Money, to enable that Governor to raife feveral new Troops, and to make fuch other preparations, as might be neceffary for the sccurity of those Countreys.

Dantzick, April 28. As the Summer advances, fo our Fears increase, of an Invasion from the Furks; for our Letters arrived this week from the Frontiers, affure us, that the Ottoman Troops were about paffing the Nc/t r, in order to their entring in-to the $U_k rain$, and that a v-ry confiderable Body of Men were already arrived at Caminuc in Podolia; The Tartars are ordered to be ready t joyn with them, and other great preparations are making, as if they intended nothing lefs, then the Conqueft of the whole Kingdom; however, we promife our felves, that they will not find their work to eafy, as they did the last Summer, we being now united amongs our felves, and backt with the friendship of the Czar of Mrscovy, who hath by several Messen gers of late, de-clared to this Crown his resolution of assisting us, against our Common Enemy; to confirm which, his Forces are as we are told, already on their march, and are ordered part of them to tall into Tartary, to give those People'a diversion, whils the rest of his Forces joyn with ours, and so proceed together against the Enemy. The Dukedom of Lythuania is to furnish for the prefent 6000 Men, to be joyned with the fland ing Army or this Kingdom, which will be increafed, aftoon as the Moneys neceffary for their fublistance can be raifed ; and in the mean time, in cafe of neceffity, the Nobility will come into the Field again, as they did the latt Summer, and act, its hoped, more unanimoufly, then they could do then for the common good. We likewife feem to expect an affiltance proportionable to the danger that threatens us, from the Emperor, in cafe the continual troubles in *Hungary* do not oblige his Imperial Majefty to employ all his Forces that way, but we hope the contrary.

Hambrough, May 5. From Stockholme our I etters fay, that the preparations of that Crown are not fo great, as have been reported, and that by Sea they make not any at all; That General Wrangel would not come over into Germany, till towards Autumne, unless some alteration in the present poslure of affairs there, should oblige him to make more hast; That their Majesties were going to pass fome time in the Countrey, though not far from Stockholme; and that the Count Bernard Oxenstern, is made Vice-Chancellor of the Kingdom. The Dutch have reported here in Town, that the Crown of Danemark was to fend a Squadron of men of Wat to their affiftance this Summer; though at the fame time our Letters from Copenhagen; make not any mention of it, nay farther, do not fpeak of any Men of War that Crown is fitting out. From Germany they still continue to write, of a Cessation
