Petersbourg, May 6.

**T**HE 28th of last Month being the Anniversary of the Czarina's Coronation, all the foreign Ministers had the Honour in the Morning to make their Compliments on that Occasion to her Majesty. At Night there was a Ball at Court, and the Town was finely illuminated as usual; but there were no Fire-works on the River, the Ice not being yet all gone. Baron Kettler is made one of the Czarina's Chamberlains. This Court is fitting out at Crownstad a Man of War of 100 Guns, one of 64, and three of 54, and two Frigats of 32, which will be ready to put to Sea as soon as the Ice is gone.

Berlin, May 26, N. S. Yesterday his Prussian Majesty made a general Review, for the second Time, of the 20 Battallions of Foot which are now in this Town. The true Reason, it seems, why he kept them out so short a Time on Saturday last, was, because the Weather was a little dark, which prevented his having a clear View of the Motions on the Right and Left of the Line. The Regiment of Gen's d'Armes, late Felt Marshal Natzmar's, has been given to Colonel Panewitz, who was Colonel Commander of the same.
