HE 28th of last Month being the Anniversary of the Czarina's Coronation, all the foreign Ministers had the Honour in the Morning to make their Compliments on that Occasion to her Majesty. At Night there was a Ball at Court, and the Town was finely illuminated as usual; but there were no Fire-works on the River, the Ice not being yet all gone. Baron Kettler is made one of the Czarina's Chamberlains.
