Vienna, May 27, N. S. HE Great Duke and Dutchels of Tuscany are expected here on Sa-turday next. 'The Dutchess Dowager of Lorrain came as far as to Infpruch, to fee the Grand Duke and Prince

Charles her Sons, and the Grand Dutchess her Daughter-in-Law, and had the Pleasure of passing three or four Days there with them.

Vienna, May 30, N. S. Their Royal Highneffes the Duke and Dutchels of Tufcany, and Prince Charles of Lorrain, being arrived by Water in the Neighbourhood of this City, palled by this Morning about Eight of the Clock in their Way to Laxemberg, being faluted from our Ramparts with the firing of 30 Cannon. The Elector of Bavaria having offered, befides the Recruits neceffary to compleat his Troops already in Hungary, 850 Horfe, and 700 Foot, they have been accepted; fo that the Bavarian Troops in the Imperial Service will amount

to 9000 Men this Campaign. Hambourg, June 2, N. S. The Duke of Holftein's Indipolition feem'd at first to be attended with fuch bad Symptoms, that his Highness was judged to be in great Danger; but by the Letters that came in here this Morning, his Highness is a little better.
