Dresden, July 1, N.S. By a Messenger who arrived here the 28th past from the Russian Army marching in four Columns un-der the Command of Feldt Marshal Munich, we have Advice, that that General came upon the Frontiers of Poland the 8th Instant, and passed by Triliss the rath, and that the general Rendezvous of the Army is to be at Wolodarka; which Route seems to tend to Choczim. The said General in a Letter to his Polish Majesty, promises to observe the strictest Order.
