Stockholm, June 22.

ON the 20th Instant M. Gedda was declared Chancellor of the Court by the King of Sweden in the Senate. At the same time General Foucks, now Stadholder, was succeeded in the Command of the Regiment of Sudermania by his Lieutenant Colonel Von Effen; and Count Frolick, made three or four Years ago Governour of Western Bothnia, was advanced to the Presidentship of the Parliament of Abo, in the Room of the Senator Akerhielm.

Berlin, July 7, N. S. His Prussian Majesty sets out to Morrow Morning, at Break of Day, for Prussia; the Prince Royal, the Prince of Anhalt Dessau, and several other Persons of Distinction who have the Honour to accompany the King of Prussia in this Journey, left this Place this Afternoon, and his Prussian Majesty will overtake them at Cöslin, where he designs to pass in Review the late Felt-Marshal Gromkow's Regiment, which is quartered there, and 'tis thought, that on this Occasion his Prussian Majesty will name the Person who is to succeed the said Felt-Marshal in the Command of that Corps. The Margrave of Bareuth arrived here a few Days ago to make a Visit to the King and Queen of Prussia, which proved an agreeable Surprize to their Prussian Majesties, who did not expect him. 'Tis at last fix'd that M. Rarefeld shall reside at the Hague as his Prussian Majesty's Minister, in the Room of M. Luifcius.
