Y Hereas many and repeated Depre-King of Spain or his Governors, contrary to the Law of Nations, and in Violation of the Treaties fublifting between the Crown of Great Britain and Spain, whereby his Majejefty's trading Subjects have not only fultained great Loss, but have allo suffered in their Perfons by the Cruelties and Barbarities which have been exercifed by the faid Spanish Guarda Coftas : And whereas his Majefty has cauled repeated Inflances and Representations to be made from Fishe to Time at the Court of Spain, in order to obtain Redress and Satisfaction for such injurious Preatment and unjust Practices, and to prevent the like Violenges for the future : And whereas a Convention for making Reparation to his Majefty's Subjects for their Lofles by the faid Depredations and Seizures, was concluded between his Majefty and the King of Spain on the Fourteenth Day of January laft N. S. by which Convention it was flipulated, that a certain Sum of Money should be paid at London within a Term in the faid Convention specified, as a Ballance admitted to be due on the Part of Spain to the Crown and Subjects of Great Britain, which Term, did expire on the Twenty Fifth Day of May last; and the Payment of the faid stipulated Sum, as agreed by the abovementioned Convention, has not been made, by which incans the fald Convention has been violated and broke on the Part of the Grown of Spain, and his Majefty's Subjects remain without any Reparation of Satisfaction for their many, great, and grievous Loss a His Majefty hath therefore taken this disjurious Proceeding of the Grown of Sprin into his ferious Confideration, and his Majetty having determined to take fuch. Measures as are necellary for vindicating the Honour of his Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction to his injuted Subjects, is pleafed by and with the Advice of his Privy-Council, to order, and it is hereby order'd, that

general Reprizals be granted against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the King of Spains fo that as well his Majefty's Fleet and Ships, as alfo all other Ships and Vellels that thall be commifdations have been committee, and many unjuft Seizures have been made in the Weft-Indies, and elfewhere, by Spanish Guarda Costas and Ships acting under the Committions of the Ships acting or his Governors, contrary to feize all Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging. to the King of Spain or his Subjects, or others inhabiting within any the Territories of the King of Spain, and bring the fame to Judg-ment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within his Majefly's Dominions; and to that endhis Majesty's Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to pre-pare the Draught of a Committion, and prefent the fame to his Majefty at this Board, authorizing the Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to illue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Replizal to any of his Majefty's Subjects, or others whom the faid Committioners thall deem fitly qualified in that behalf, for the apprehending feizing and taking the Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to Spain, and the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Spain, or any Inhabiting within his Countries, Territorias or Dominions; and that fuch Powers and Claufes be inferred in the faid Committion as have been usual and are according to former Precedents; And his Majefty's faid Ad-vocate Ocueral, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commillion, and prefent the fame to his Majelty at this Board, autho-rizing the faid Commillioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to Will and Requite the High Court of Add miralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, as also the feveral Courts of Admiralty within his Majefty's Dominions, to take Coghizance of, and judi-cially proceed upon all and all Manner of Cap-tures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or fhall be taken, and to hear and determine the fame, and according to the Course of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Vefiels and Goods as shall belong to Spain, or the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Spain, Of
