THereas many and repeated Depredations have been commuted, and many unjust Seizures have been made in the West-Indies, and or otherwise by his Majesty's Commissioners or otherwise by his Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admissions of the Ships acting under the Commissions of the ral of Great Britain, shall and may lawfully seize all Ships, Vessels and Goods belonging the King of Spain or his Subjects, or others King of Spain or his Governors, contrary to the Law of Nations, and in Violation of the Treaties subsisting between the Crown of Great Britain and Spain, whereby his Majejesty's trading Subjects have not only suitained great Losses, but have also suffered in their Persons by the Cruelties and Barbarities which have been exercifed by the faid Spanish Guarda Costas: And whereas his Majestý has cauled repeated Instances and Representations to be made from Fine to Time at the Court of Spain, in order to obtain Redress and Satisfaction for such injurious Preatment and unjust Practices, and to prevent the like Violenges for the future: And whereas a Convention for making Reparation to his Majesty's Subjects for their Losses by the faid Depredations and Seizures, was concluded between his Majesty and the King of Spain on the Fourteenth Day of January last N. S. by which Convention it was stipulated, that a certain Sum of Money should be paid at London within a Term in the said Convention specified, as a Ballance admitted to be due on the Part of Spain to the Crown and Subjects of Great Britain, which Term, did expire on the Twenty Fifth Day of May last; and the Payment of the said stipulated Sum, as agreed by the abovementioned Convention, has not been made, by which ineans the fald Convention has been violated and broke on the Part of the Crown of Spain, and his Majesty's Subjects remain without any Reparation of Satisfaction for sheir many, great, and grievous Losses: His Majesty hath therefore taken this injurious Proceeding of the Grown of Spain into-his ferious Confideration, and his Majesty having determinat to take fuch. Measures as are necessary for vindicating the Homour of his Crown, and for procuring Reparation and Satisfaction to his injuted Subjects, is pleased by and with the Advice of his Privy-Council, to order, and it is hereby order'd, that

general Reprizals be granted against the Ships Goods, and Subjects of the King of Spains to that as well his Majesty's Fleet and Ships, as also all other Ships and Vessels that shall be commisto the King of Spain or his Subjects, or others inhabiting within any the Territories of the King of Spain, and bring the same to Judgment in any of the Courts of Admiralty within his Majesty's Dominions; and to that endhis Majesty's Advocate General, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are forthwith to pre-pare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to his Majesty at this Board, authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to issue forth and grant Letters of Marque and Replizal to any of his Majesty's Subjects, or others whom the faid Commissioners shall deem firly qualified in that behalf, for the apprehending feizing and taking the Ships, Veffels and Goods belonging to Spain, and the Vaffals and Subjects of the King of Spain, or any Inhabiting within his Countries, Territories or Dominions; and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been Julial and are according to former Precedents; And his Majesty's said Advocate Ceneral, with the Advocate of the Admiralty, are also forthwith to prepare the Draught of a Commission, and present the same to his Majesty at this Board, authorizing the said Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral, to Will and Require the High Court of Add miralty of Great Britain, and the Lieutenant and Judge of the faid Court, as also the feveral Courts of Admiralty within his Majesty's Dominions, to take Coghizance of, and judicially proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Seizures, Prizes, and Reprizals of all Ships and Goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the fame, and according to the Course of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations, to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Veffels and Goods as shall belong to Spain, or the Vassals and Subjects of the King of Spain,
