A PROCLAMATION,

For enlarging the Time given by a former Proclamation for Seamen to enter them felves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, and be entitled to the Encouragement thereby giveu.

GEORGE R.

THereas by our Royal Proclamation, dated the Fifteenth Day of June last, intituled, A Proclamation for encouraging Seamen and Landmen to enter themselves on Board His Majesty's Ships of War, We were graciously pleased to promise Six Months pay certain to all Seamen and able-bodied Landmen, who should, on or before the Fourteenth Day of this Instant July, voluntarily enter them-felves in our Service, in such Manner as in our faid Proclamation is expressed, though it should happen that there should be no Occasion for their Service for so long a Time: And whereas we are willing to continue the faid Encouragements to all such Seamen or Seafaring Men only, fit for our said Service, who have voluntarily entred, or shall voluntarily tarily enter themselves at or before the Times herein after mentioned; we have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to publish this our Royal Proclamation: And we do hereby promise and declare, That all such Seamen, or Seafaring Men only, fit for our Service, who since the said Fourted, or on or before the Twenty fourth Day of August poets. Day of August next, shall voluntarily enter themselves in our Service, in the Mariner directed by our said recited Proclamation, shall be affured of receiving Six Months Pay cer-tain, although it should happen that there should be no Occasion for their Service for fo long a Time. And we do hereby require and command all our Justices of the Peace, Vice-Admirals, Captains of our Ships of War, and all other Persons whatsoever, to keep and observe the same Orders and Directions in respect to Seamen or Seafaring Men fit for our Service, so entring themselves in our Service on or before the said Twenty sourth Day of August next, as are given and directed by our faid recited Proclamation, in respect

of Seamen entring themselves on or before the said Fourteenth Day of July. Given at our Court at Kensington, the Twenty-sixth Day of July, 1739, and in the Thirteenth Year of our Reign. God saye the King.

This Morning about Eleven the Czarina, the Prince and Princes, Princes Elizabeth, the Duke and Dutchess of Courland, and all the great Officers and Ruffiant Nobility, went to the Church of St. Mary, of Cazan, at the Entrance of the Town, where the Prince and Princels were married by a Ruffian Archbishop. There was a proger Place appointed in the Church for the Foreign Ministers and alk the Russian Nobility to see, this great Ceremony. The Magnifi cency of the Cavalcade, the fine Cloaths and Equipages, that have been made on this Occalion, cannot be sufficiently described. All this Week is to be employed in different Diversions at Court.

1 Stockholm, July 10. An Ordinance was published last Sunday in all the Churches in Town, expressly forbidding every body to contradict, insult, or quarrel with any of the French Sailors; and the same was repeated Yesterday by Beat of Drum, in the more general Terms of any Foreigners of what Rank or Quality soever, or any body belonging to them. It is supposed that the two raised Regiments embarked Yesterday at Carlsham for Finland on board of ten Transports convoyed by two Frigates of 30 Guns.
