Stockholm, July 17.

HE King of Sweden was on board the Bourbon on Saturday in the Afternoon, accompanied by the Counts de la Gardie and Gillenbourg, Mell. Allebourg, Wibel, and others ; a Company of the Guards was drawn up on the Ship's Bridge, and as foon as his Majefty's Barge put off, on a Signal from the French Admiral, there immediately follow'd a Volley of the Small Arms from all the Ships, and then a general Difcharge of all the Canand then a general Difcharge of all the Can-non except of the Bourbon, not to incom-mode his Swedifh Majefty, who was received by M: d'Antin at his Barge. A Colla-tion was prepared, but the King of Sweden only sook a Glafs of Burgundy to drink the Admiral's Health, and after having been through the Ship and flayed about, an Hour, return'd, when he was again falu-ted by a general Difcharge of the Cannon of all the Ships, the Bourbon included. The Marquefs d'Antin, with his Officers, and the Marquels d'Antin, with his Officers, and the French Amballadour, were treated last Night at Ulrics-Dahl by the King of Sweden's Ordor, the Count and Countels de la Gardie doing, the Honours; feveral Senators were there alfo.

VIENNA.

Journal from the Imperial Army commanded by Felt-Mar(bal Count Wallis.

On the 17th of July the Army marched to a new Camp, which the Quarter-mafters had mark'd out the Day before, at Wifniza, all but nine Battallions, viz. two of Old Daun, two of Seckendorf, two of Young Daun, two of Cologne, and one of Bavaria, which remained in the Camp of Merova. The fame Day General Neiperg with the Body of Forces he commands, was to encamp at Jaboka, and the faid nine Battallions

On the 18th we received Advice, that the whole Turkilh Army was arrived at Rawna, and defigned to pals the Morave, upon which Marshal Wallis came immediately to a Reto order the Body under the folution Command of General Neiperg, to join the main Army. The 21ft we learnt that the Furks had a confiderable Body encamped at Semendria, and a firong Detachment at Krozka, which they were continually reinforcing : Whereupon it was refolved in a Council of War, at which the Generals Neiperg and Sehr, the Prince of Hildsburgfhaufen and General Styrum affifted, not to wait for the Body commanded by Count Neiperg, but to attack the Enemy before they had fortified themfelves at Krozka, which is a very advantagious Poft. Purfuant thereto, Marthal Wallis marched the fame Evening, without Beat of Drum, or Sound of Trumpet, with 14 Regiments of Horler and 18 Companies of Grenadiers, being himfelf at their Head, accompanied by General Seht ; leaving Orders for Prince Hildsburghausen to follow him with all the Infantry; Gene-ral Neiperg promifing to haften his Troops to Wifniza. The 22d at Day-Break Marshal Wallis arrived at Kroska with his Detach-ment, and immediately pulled the Enemy on all Sides, notwithstanding the Approaches to-Krozka were very difficult, becaule there was no coming at the Enemy but through De-files. The Regiment of Hohenzollern, which had behaved extremely well, having advanced too far, was attacking sirefh and forced to abandon all the Advantages it had gained; which unfortunately prevented the Marshal's Defign, and obliged him to retreat to the Mountains, at the very Time that Prince Hildsburgf. haulen arrived with the Infantry. The Prince immediately made himfelt Mafter of a Poft at the Right, on the maintaining of which Poft left in the Camp were ordered to join him. the Retreat entirely depended; there the Enemy



Enemy attack'd him feveral Times, but were) always reputted. The Turks have never been feen to make fo continual and obstinate a Fire as they did during the whole Day and Part of the Night. Prince Charles of Lor-rain and Prince Waldeck maintained their Posts several Hours against them. In the Night we retired into our old Camp, but cannot remain long there for Want of Fo-The Number of the killed and rage. wounded is not yet known, because the Lists were not made out before the general Ac-count of this Action was dispatched to Vienna. Among the killed are General Larf-ner, Count Caraffa, the young Prince of Waldeck, and (as is fuppoled) the Prince of Heffe Rhinfels; amongst the wounded are the Prince of Waldeck and Count Daun.
