Leghorn, July 24.

THE Beginning of this Month are rived here his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Dolphin, Lord Aubrey Vere Commander, last from Genoa, from whence she brought the Earl of Pomfret and his Family, (who it is said defined to pass some Time at Sendarish and the Larl of Sandwich, and the Lord Charles Fitzroy. On the 7th came into this Port two of the Pope's Gallies, which had carried from Civita Vecchia to Genoa Sig. Oddi, the Pope's Nuncio to the Court of Portugal, who on the 27th past sailed in an English Ship for Lisbon. The same Day arrived here from Lisbon. The fame Day arrived here from Genoa the Envoy of the States General, in his Way to the Court of Naples. We have an Account from Modena, that three French Gallies being appointed to fail from Marfeilles to Antibes, to conduct from thence to Genoa the Dutchess of Modena, on her Return from Paris to Modena, the Duke had sent Count Guicciardi, a Gentleman of his Bedchamber, and an Officer of his Life-Guards, to attend her Highness at Genoa. On the 11th failed Westward the Dolphin, commanded by Lord Aubrey Vere. On the 13th M. de Wachtendonck reviewed the Regiment of Palavicini in the Presence of the Lord Pomfret, who on the 19th set out for Sienna.

Florence, July 27. A few Days ago an Order was published here, commanding all Persons possess'd of Lands in the Country, to let up Beehives, for increasing the Production of Wax and Honey, under a severe Penalty if the Order be not complied with in twelve Months. About 50 Families of Pea-fants are arrived here from Lorrain, if order to fettle themselves in the Maremme of Sienna, and cultivate that Part of the Country which is mostly uninhabited: For their Encouragement, each Family is allow'd by the Government a certain Quantity of Ground with a few Cattle and other Things neces-fary for their Subliffance; till they can maintain themselves upon the Produce of their Settlements. 4 On the 24th Sig. Caspari, the Great Duke's Commissary at War, set out from hence to review the Tuscan Garrisons at Pila, Leghorn, Porto Ferraio, and Groß leto.
