Leghorn, July 24.

THE Beginning of this Month ar-rived here his Britannick Majefty's Ship the Dolphit, Lord Aubrey Vere Commander, laft from Gea noa, from whence the brought the Earl of Pomfret and his Family, (who it is faid dea fign to pass fome Time at Sienna) the Earl of Sandwich, and the Lord Charles Fitzroy. On the 7th came into this Port two of the Pope's Gallies, which had carried from Ci-vita Vecchia to Genoa Sig. Oddi, the Pope's Nuncio to the Court of Portugal, who on the 27th paft failed in an English Ship for Lisbon. The time Day arrived here from Lisbon. The fame Day arrived here from Genoa the Envoy of the States Generaly in his Way to the Court of Naples. We have an Account from Modena, that three French. Gallies being appointed to fail from Mar-feilles to Antibes, to conduct from thence to Genoa the Dutchefs of Mødena, on her Return from Paris to Modena, the Duke had sent Count Guicciardi, a Gentleman of his Bedchamber, and an Officer of his Life-Guards, to attend her Highness at Genoa. On the rith failed Weftward the Dolphin, comman-ded by Lord Aubrey Vere. On the 13th M. de Wachtendonck reviewed the Regiment of Palavicini in the Prefence of the Lord Pomfret, who on the foth fet out for Sienna.

Florence, July 27. A few Days ago an Order was published here, commanding all Perfons pollefs'd of Lands in the Country, to fet up Beehives, for increasing the Production of Wax and Honey, under a fevere Penalty if the Order be not complied with in twelve Months. About 50 Families of Pea-fants are arrived here from Lorrain, it order to fettle themselves in the Maremme of Sienna, and cultivate that Part of the Country which is mostly uninhabited : For their Encouragement, each Family is allow'd by the Government a certain Quantity of Ground with a few Cattle and other Things necef-fary for their Subfiftance; till they can main-

tain themfelves upon the Produce of their Settlements. On the 14th Sig. Caspari, the Great Duke's Commiffary at War, let duc from hence to review the Tulcan Garrilons at Pila, Leghorn, Porto Ferraio, and Grof-leto. Several Pieces of Brais Cannon have been brought hither from Sienna and other Fortrefles of this State, in order to be new eaft.
