HE King of Sweden came to Town last Monday from Carlsberg, when M. Pechlin, Minister of the late Duke of Holstein, had an Audience of his Majefty, and deliver'd his new Credentials from the prefent Duke; he had alfo Credentials to the Queen of Sweden, which he deliver'd to the King for her Maiefty.

Copenhagen, Aug. 25, N. S. On the 23d Inftant in the Evening, the Marquels d'Antin, with his Squadron confifting of four Men of War and a Frigate, came to an Anchor before this Place.

The Damage which the Fleuron received in paffing from Stockholm to the Sea, is not to confiderable as was apprehended at first; so that they have not thought fit to bring her either into the Swedish or Danish Dock, both

which were offered if neceffary. Berlin, Aug. 29, N.S. On the 15th In-ftant between Ten and Eleven at Night, his Pruffian Majefty arrived here in perfect good Health. The Prince Royal came on the 17th, as also all the Generals and Officers who had accompanied the King of Pruflia in this Jour-ney. As his Pruflian Majefty came through Pomerania on his Return, he disposed of the late Feldt-Marshal Gromkow's Regiment in Favour of Colonel la Mothe. On the 21st his Majesty left this Place to go to Potz-The fame Day Baron Brakel, the Ruldam. fian Minister to this Court, arrived here from Vienna. His Prussian Majesty returned hither this Morning from Potzdam ; and defigns af-ter a few Days to go to Wusterhausen, where he will spend the Hunting Season, as usual.
