*Stockholm, September 28.*

**T**HE Battallion of Sudermania marched thro' this City last Wednesday in its Way to the Rendezvous for embarking. The King saw it from the Windows of the Governour of this City, that Regiment formerly belonging to him the said Governour. His Majesty went about three Miles off to review the Battallion of Ostrogothia, and returned last Night; and set out this Morning for Ekelsund, in order to see the Battallions of three or four other Regiments which are to pass through the Neighbourhood of that Place. On the 20th Instant M. Burnaby, Secretary from his Britannick Majesty to this Court, had his first Audiences of their Swedish Majesties.

*Stockholm, Oct. 3.* The Chancery received the 29th past, all the Letters seized upon the late unfortunate Major Sinclair; they were addressed to the Swedish Commissary at Ham bourg, but from whence it is not known, and that Commissary forwarded them hither.

*Copenhagen, Oct. 17, N. S.* The Court being Yesterday in Devotion, there was no Council at Hirschholm: And Preparations are now making for the Reception of their Danish Majesties at Fridericksberg, whither they intend to remove next Week, and to reside there during the Winter. Yesterday in the Afternoon General Diemar arrived here, and early this Morning pursued his Journey for Stockholm.

*Vienna, Oct. 17, N. S.* It is said that two or three Regiments which have served very ill are to be broken, and as many more new Regiments incorporated. It is proposed to have 20000 Men in Flanders, 30000 in Italy, and 80000 more for other Services: For the ordinary Maintenance of which last Number, the others being provided for by the respective States of Flanders and Italy, there were assigned and set apart eight Millions an-

nually during the Time of the late Prince Eugene of Savoy.

*Berlin, Oct. 20, N. S.* There are some very warm Disputes between this Court and that of Dresden about recruiting Affairs. A Saxon Lieutenant was a few Days ago confined Prisoner to the Main-Guard here; by way of Retaliation for a Prussian Under-Officer who is in Arrest in Saxony, for having attempted to seduce some Men out of the King of Poland's Service.

*Hague, Oct. 27, N. S.* Letters from St. Hubertsbourg relate, that the Vice-Chancellor Malakowsky had received an Express from Warlaw, with the News, that Count Munich having advanced from Jassi to Bender, had made himself Master of that Place without any Opposition, upon the first of this Month; and that the Tartars of Budziack, and Bielgerod, had come in and submitted to him. We wait for further Advice before we give entire Credit to this News.
