Stockholm, September 28.

HE Battallion of Sudermania marched thro' this City laft Wednefday in its Way to the Rendezvous for embarking. The King faw it from the Windows of the Governour of this City, that Regiment formerly belonging to him the faid Governour. His Majeffy went about three Miles off to review the Battallion of Offrogothia, and returned laft Night; and fet out this Morning for Ekelfund, in order to fee the Battallions of three or four other Regiments which are to pafs through the Neighbourhood of that Place. On the 20th Inftant M. Burnaby, Secretary from his Bri tannick Majeffy to this Court, had his firft Audiences of their Swedifh Majefties.

Yefterday in the Afternoon General Diemar arrived here, and early this Morning purfued his Journey for Stockholm.

Vienna, Off. 17, N. S. It is faid that two or three Regiments which have ferved very ill are to be broken, and as many more new Regiments incorporated. It is proposed to have 20000 Men in Flanders, 30000 in Italy, and 80000 more for other Services: For the ordinary Maintenance of which last Number, the others being provided for by the respective States of Flanders and Italy, there were affigued and fet apart eight Millions annually during the Time of the late Prince Eugene of Savoy.

Berlin, Oct. 20, N. S. There are fome very warm Diffutes between this Court and that of Dresden about recruiting Affairs. A Saxon Lieutenant was a few Days ago confined Prisoner to the Main-Guard here; by way of Retalliation for a Prussian Under-Officer who is in Arrest in Saxony, for having attempted to feduce fome Men out of the King of Poland's Service.

Hague, Oct. 27, N. S. Letters from St. Hubertsbourg relate, that the Vice-Chancellor Malakowsky had received an Express from Warlaw, with the News, that Count Munich having advanced from Jass to Bender, had made himself Master of that Place without any Opposition, upon the first of this Month; and that the Tartars of Budziack, and Bielgerod, had come in and submitted to him.
