all other Princes and States of Europe, pof-felled of Settlements in the Weft Indies, or whofe Subjects carry on any Trade thither; And whereas befides the notorious Grounds of Complaint above-mentioned, many other Infractions have been made on the Part of Spain, of the feveral Treaties and Conventions fubfifting between us and that Crown, and particularly of that concluded in the Year 1667, as well by the exorbitant Duties and Impofitions laid upon the Trade and Commerce of our Subjects, as by the Breach of ancient and eftablished Privileges, stipulated for them by the faid Treaties; For the Redrefs of which Grievances, the strongest Instances have been, from Time to Time, made by our feveral Mi-nifters refiding in Spain, without any Effect; And whereas a Convention, for making Reparation to our Subjects for the Loffes fultained by them, on account of the unjust Seizures and Depredations committed by the Spaniards in America, and in order to prevent for the future all the Grievances and Caufes of Complaint therein taken Notice of, and to remove abfolutely, and for ever, every thing which might give Occasion thereto, was concluded between us, and the King of Spain, on the 14th Day of January last, N.S. by which Convention it was flipulated, That a certain Sum of Money flould be paid at Lon-don, within a Term therein specified, as a Balance admitted to be due, on the Part of Spain, to the Crown and Subjects of Great Britain, which Term expired on the 25th Day of May last, and the Payment of the faid Sum was not made, according to the Stipulation for that Purpole; by which Means the Convention above-mentioned was manifeftly violated and broken by the King of Spain, and our Subjects remained without any Satisfaction or Reparation for the many grievous Loffes fultained by them; And the Methods, agreed upon by the faid Convention, in order to the Obtaining future Security for the Trade and Navigation of our Subjects are, contrary to good Faith, fruftrated and defeated : In Confequence of which, we found ourfelves obliged, for Vindicating the Honour of our Crown, and for procuring Reparation, and Satisfaction for our injured Subjects, to order, That general Reprizals fhould be granted against the faid King of Spain, his Vaffals and Subjects, and their Ships, Goods, and Effects : And whereas the Court of Spain has been induced to colour the open Violation of the Convention aforefaid, by Reafons and Pretences, which are void of all Foundation : And, at the fame Time, has not only pub-lished an Order, figned by the faid King, for feizing the Ships, Goods, and Effects belonging to us, and our Subjects, where-ever they shall be met with, but has caused Seizures to be actually made of the Goods and Effects of our Subjects, refiding in his Dominions, and has also ordered our faid Subjects to de-part out of the Spanish Dominions, within a ihort limited Time, contrary to the express Stipulations of the Treaties between the two Crowns, even in Cafe of a War actually declared, We have taken into our Royal and most Serious Confideration these Injuries, which have been offered to us and our Subjects, and the

manifest Violation of the several Treaties subfifting between the two Crowns; all which have been, in many Particulars, eluded, or evaded, by the unwarrantable Behaviour of the Court of Spain, and their Officers, notwithstanding the repeated Instances we have given, of our Defire to cultivate a good Understanding with the King of Spain, and the effential Proofs of our Friendship and Regard for him and his Family, which we have de-monstrated to all the World : And being fully fatisfied, that the Honour of our Crown, the Interest of our Subjects, and that Regard, which ought to be had to the most folemn Treaties, call upon us to make Use of the Power, which God has given us, for vindicating our undoubted Rights, and fecuring to our loving Subjects the Privileges of Navigation and Commerce to which they are justly entitled : We therefore, relying on the Help of Almighty God, who knows the Uprightness of our Intentions, have thought fit to declare, and do hereby declare War against the faid King of Spain; And we will, in Purfuance of fuch Declaration, vigoroufly profecute the faid War, being affured of the ready Concurrence and Affiftance of all our loving Subjects, in fo just a Cause, wherein the Honour of our Crown, the Maintenance of our folemn Treaties, and the Trade and Navigation of our Subjects, (which are fo effential to the Welfare, and Prosperity of this Nation, and which we are determined, at all Times, with our utmost Power to preferve and support) are fo greatly concerned : And we do here-by will, and require, our Generals and Commanders of our Forces, our Commissioners for Executing the Office of High Admiral of Great Britain, our Lieutenants of our feveral Counties, Governors of our Forts and Garrifons, and all other Officers, and Soldiers under them, by Sea and Land, to do, and execute all Acts of Hostility in the Profecution of this War against the faid King of Spain, his Vallals, and Subjects, and to oppole their Attempts : And we do hereby command, as well our own Subjects, as advertife all other Perfons, of what Nation foever, not to tranfport, or carry any Soldiers, Arms, Powder, Ammunition, or other contraband Goods, to any of the Territories, Lands, Plantations, or Countries of the faid King of Spain : Declaring, that whatfoever Ship or Veffel shall be met withal, transporting, or carrying any Soldiers, Arms, Powder, Ammunition, or other contraband Goods, to any of the Territories, Lands, Plantations, or Countries of the faid King of Spain, the fame, being ta-ken, fhall be condemned as good and lawful Prize. Given at our Court at Kenfington the Ninetcenth Day of October, 1739, in the Thirteenth Year of our Reign. GOD fave the KING.
