Enfiedel, one of the King's Chamberlains, returned hither the 28th Instant from Vienna, bringing with him the Procuration of the Archdutchess Mary-Anne to the Princels of Weislensels to represent her Perfon as Godinother at the Ceremony of Baptizing the young Prince. On the 29th the Pope's Nuncio received by an Effaffette a like Procuration from the Pope, to perform in his Name the Function of Godfather. The Elector of Bavaria had before fent his Commillion to the Prince Royal Xavier, to reprefent him as the other Godfather.

Dresden, Nov. 4, N. S. We have diffe-rent Advices as to the Czarina's Ratification of the Preliminaries of Peace between Her and the Porte. In the mean time, Count Munich waits his Orders at Choczim, having laid four Bridges on the Dniefter, which makes fome of the Poles fearful of his Motions and Defigns of taking up his Winter Quarters in their Country. Deputies from the Palati-nate of Belsk are arrived here, to petition the King, that they and their Country-men may have the Loffes they have already fuffered by the Coflacks made good to them; and that in cafe the Ruffian Troops should repais through Part of Poland, they may not winter there, but make as flort a Stay as possible. Being admitted to an Au-dience of the King, he commanded the Vice-Chancellor of the Crown to allure them in his Prefence, that having nothing more at Heart than the Prefervation and Welfare of his faithful Subjects, he would, pursuant to their Request, cause the Instances to be repeated which had been already made to the Court of Russia on this Subject.
