Vienna, December 2, N. S.

ON the 30th past, being the Festival of St. Andrew, Patron of the Order of the Golden Fleece, the Emperour, in the Habit of that Order, preceded by the Officers, went to the Aulick Church of the Augustines, and held a Chapter of the Order, ten of the Knights formerly created being present in their Habits of Ceremony; and those Persons who were designed to be now received into the Order attended: Divine Service being perform'd as usual on such an Occasion, his Imperial Majesty was pleased to create the following Persons Knights of the Golden Fleece, viz. the Prince of Aversperg, Count Dietrichstein, Count Windisgratz, Count Wurmbrand, the Count de Cerbellon, Gundaker Count Althan, the Marquess de Peflora, the Prince of Salm, the Prince of Strongoli, Don Lucio di Sangro, and Michael Count Althan, and they were invested with the Habit of the Order. Which done, High Mass was celebrated, Cardinal Colonitz our Archbishop officiating pontifically. From the Church the Emperour with the Knights returned to the Palace; where his Imperial Majesty, at a Table by himself under a Canopy, and all the Knights at a Table before His, dined in publick. Other Knights who were absent were nominated by his Imperial Majesty in the Chapter, viz. the Electoral Prince of Saxony, the Electoral Prince of Bavaria, the Prince of Saxe Hilbourghausen, the Prince of Sultzbach, Winceslaus Count Lichtenstein, Prince Lobkowitz, the Prince de Craon, Count Schafgotsch, Field-Marshal Palfi, and the Prince of Horn. Couriers have been dispatch'd to these absent Knights, to acquaint them with their new Promotion.

Rome, Nov. 21. On the 15th Instant M. Harrach received an Express from the Court of Vienna, with Orders to signify to the Constable Colonna to deliver up to the Prince di Santa Croce the Collar of the Order of the Golden Fleece, which Order of Knighthood was conferred on him by the Emperour some Time ago; he having lately accepted the Order of St. Januarius from the King of Naples.

Leghorne, Nov. 27, N. S. On the 25th anchored in this Port his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Tyger, with five large English Merchant Ships, bound for the two Sicilies and Venice.

This Day M. Zamboni had a private Audience of his Majesty, at which he deliver'd his new Letters of Credence, as Resident from the Landgrave of Hesse Darmstadt; being introduced by the Right Hon. the Lord Harrington, one of his Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Knt.
