From the Church the Emperour with the Knights returned to the Palace; where his Imperial Majefty, at a Table by himfelf under a Canopy, and all the Knights at a Table before His, dined in publick. Other Knights who were abfent were nominated by his Imperial Majefly in the Chapter, viz. the Electoral Prince of Saxony, the Electoral Prince of Bavaria, the Prince of Saxe Hil-bourghaufen, the Prince of Sultzbach, Winceflaus Count Lichtenstein, Prince Lobkowitz, the Prince de Craon, Count Schaf-gotich, Field-Marshal Palfi, and the Prince of Horn. Couriers have been dispatch'd to these absent Knights, to acquaint them with their new Promotion.
