Petersbourg, November 24.

HE foremost Body of the Troops which are returning from Wala chia, is expected in the Neighbourhood of Kiow by the End of this Month. It being unnecessary, fince the Conclusion of Peace with the Turks, to post fo great a Number of Men in the Lines of the Ukraine, as in preceeding Years; the greatest Part of the Armies commanded by General Lacy and Count Munich will have their Winter Quarters affigned them in the Provinces of this Empire which lye towards the Baltick; fo that next Spring, if the Circumstances of Affairs should require it, an Army of 80000 Men may be drawn together on the Frontiers of Finland, and one of 60000 in Livonia. Provisions for sublishing fuch great Numbers, are already brought into the Czarina's Magazines.

Berlin, Dec. 12, N. S. Preparations are making for the Reception and Entertainment of the Court of Wolfenbuttel, which is expected here fome Day next Week. An Incident hap-pen'd a few Days ago at Francfort on the Oder, which makes not a little Noise here. Nine Soldiers, all English, belonging to General Schwerin's Regiment, which is quarter'd in that Town, form'd a Defign to defert, which they executed by forcing, Sword in Hand, the Guard at one of the Gates. The Commandant being in Doubt whether a greater Number was not concerned in the fame Defign, did not think proper to order a Detach-ment to go in Pursuit of them, but sent two Officers on Horseback, who were directed to try if they could bring them back by gentle Representations and Promises of Pardon. The faid Officers overtook the Deferters at half a Mile's Diftance from the Town, and after they had spoke to them, finding their Perfuafions had no Effect, they rode up to some neighbouring Villages, and brought them a great Number of Boors armed. with The Deferters not difcouraged at this, put them-felves in a Pofture of Defence, and engaged with the Boors, of whom they killed feveral, and mortally wounded one of the Officers who headed them; but being at last overpowered by Numbers, and five of the Soldiers being mortally wounded, they were for-ced to furrender; and we fince hear that three of them were to be fhot as Yesterday or this Morning.

Hague, Dec. 15, N. S. The Deputies of feveral Towns who had returned home dur-ing the late Adjournment, being returned, the States of Holland met on the 10th In ftant, and refumed their Deliberations upon the Question of augmenting their Forces.
