BY Letters from Rome we have Advice, that Cardinal Alberoni had given out that he would leave Ravenna and retire to Placentia the Place of his Nativity, but delays his Departure from Time to Time. Sig. Herinquez, whom the Pope has nominated to go to San Marino, in order to restore that Republick to its ancient Liberty, remained at Rome till he should hear of Cardinal Alberoni's actual Departure from the Neighbourhood of San Marino. Cardinal Firrao has written a Letter to the said Cardinal Alberoni, in very strong Terms, acquainting him, that the Pope entirely disapproves his Conduct in the Affair of San Marino.

Dresden, Jan. 3, N. S. The Plague has broke out again in two or three Villages, about 10 English Miles on this Side Cracow, on the Borders of Silesia, and it is said to spread from Hungary towards that Province; but from the Precautions, and the Season of the Year, there is Reason to hope for a Deliverance from that Calamity. Some Days ago the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Hombourg arrived here incognito, having taken upon him the Name of Count Czeremetoff: He has been at Court to pay his Compliments to the King and Queen, by whom he was very graciously received, and had the Honour to dine with their Majesties.
