ON the 19th Instant our Regency ordered three Physicians and twelve Surgeons to repair forthwith to the Frontiers of Hungary, and use the necessary Precautions for preventing the bringing in of the Plague by the Saxon Troops in their Return from Hungary to their own Country. Those Troops are to be quartered in the Counties of Tirnau, Liptau, and Trenschéen, to perform Quarantain for some Time, during which every Soldier is to be visited and examined daily by the said Physicians and Surgeons; and none of them are to proceed on their March, till those Physicians, who have been solemnly sworn to do their Duty faithfully, certify that they are free from any contagious Distemper.

Vienna, Jan. 2, N. S. The Emperour has appointed Count Uhlefeld, his Ambassadour and Minister Plenipotentiary to the States General of the United Netherlands, to go with the Character of Ambassadour to the Ottoman Porte. An Expres from Rome having brought Advice of the Death of Count Harrach, his Imperial Majesty's Ambassadour at that Court; Count Daun, Auditor of the Rota, is appointed to succeed him. The Prince of Saxe-Hildburghausen, and the Generals Damnitz, Piccolomini, Ciceri, and Daun, having severally perform'd Quarantain, are arrived here from Hungary.
