**M.** Maffani, Lieutenant-Colonel in the King of Poland's Service, arrived the 8th Instant from Petersbourg, whither he was dispatched last Autumn with the Notification of her Polish Majesty's Delivery of a Prince. The Czarina has presented him with a thousand Roubles. This Gentleman brings fresh Assurances to the Poles, that her Czarish Majesty will fully compensate all the Damages sustained by the Marches of the Russian Troops through their Country. Commissaries are accordingly appointed, and are actually in Poland for examining the Pretensions of every Complainant. M. Bunau kissed the King's Hand Yesterday, his Polish Majesty having created him a titular Privy Counsellor, which Title gives him the Rank and all the Privileges belonging to those of the Council, tho' no Place in it. His Majesty has conferred the like Title of Privy Counsellor on M. d'Erffa his Minister at the Court of Vienna.

Berlin, Jan. 12, N. S. The Duke and Dutchess of Brunswick have declared their Intentions of returning Home in a very few Days. The King of Prussia, whose State of Health grows daily better, talks also of removing soon, with the Queen and young Princes and Princesses, to Potsdam, where their Prussian Majesties will reside, as usual, till the Time of the general Review.
