THE Marquis de Chetardie, the French Ambassador, arrived here the 16th, and on the 27th Instant he had a publick Audience of the Czarina.

Vienna, Jan. 20, N. S. The Saxon Troops are entirely paid off, and were to leave their Hungarian Quarters Yesterday, in order to return Home thro' Silefia. The Bavarians are said to be diminish'd from 9000 to between 2 and 3000 by the Dissentery.

Copenhagen, Jan. 16, N. S. M. Palmstierna, the new Swedish Minister, arrived here the 12th Instant at Night; and M. Skutenhielm, who was order'd to stay only till his Arrival, set out Yesterday for Stockholm: The former has not yet appeared at Court.

Berlin, Jan. 19, N. S. On Saturday last the Duke and Dutchess of Brunswick set out from this Place on their Return Home; but his Prussian Majesty, who intended to have removed as this Day to Potzdam, has put off that Journey by the Advice of his Physicians. A few Days ago his Prussian Majesty appointed M. Klingraff, a Gentleman of this Country, to be his Minister at the Court of Anspach.

Hague, Jan. 30, N. S. This Morning the States of Holland having resumed in their Assembly the Deliberations upon the two Petitions of the Council of State for an Augmentation of the Forces of the Republick both by Sea and Land, have come to a Resolution to authorize their Deputies to the States General to signify the entire Consent of this Province thereto.
