Copenhagen, January 19.

THIRTY Six Officers have been appointed, and are now setting out for the Coasts of Denmark, Norway and Holstein, to reside there in certain Districts, and to muster and watch over the Seamen who are enlisted for the Service of the Fleet: This is an ancient Establishment, laid aside in the late Reign on the Account of some Inconveniencies, but now restored, upon Experience, as it is said, that for want of some such Inspection, as well as proper Encouragement, the best Sailors continually go off into Foreign Service. M. Bestuchef had Yesterday a private Audience of the King of Denmark, to present to his Majesty a Letter with a New-Year's Compliment from the Duke of Courland.

Copenhagen, Jan. 30. M. Palmstierne appeared on the 22d Instant for the first Time at Court, and had his Audiences of the King and Queen of Denmark in private. A Proposal has been put forward by certain Merchants in France, and particularly at Bourdeaux, to settle a Trade with those of Copenhagen for salted Beef, to be transported afterwards to the French Colonies in America. The College of Commerce here being desirous to find a new Market for the Cattle of Jutland, that of the Dutch having failed, give into this Proposal. Young M. Bram, Son to the President of this City, is lately gone to France to adjust and finish the Contract; and an Agent from the French Merchants is now expected here, to oversee the Delivery of the Meat, and to answer for the Payment of it.
