Stockholm, January 4.

OST of the Members that compofe the Senate and the Chancery retired into the Country for the Holidays, fo that nothing has pass'd, during that Time, in either of those Houses, but next Week they reassure their Seffions.

Stockholm, Jan. 8. Yesterday Morning the King of Sweden set out for one of his Palaces in the Country, about four Swedish Miles off, where his Majefty proposes to divert himself with Elk Hunting till Thursday or Friday next. The Senate nevertheless affembled Yesterday for the first Time fince the Holidays.

Gottenbourg, Jan. 22. A Project is talk'd of here for making this a free Port, and that it is brought to fuch a Maturity, that it waits for nothing but the Sanction of a Diet to be carried into Execution. It is proposed that Foreigners of all Countries shall be permitted to refide here to traffick, and have the free Exercife of their Religion, ex-cept Roman Catholicks in general, and the Jews of Germany in particular. *Hambourg, Feb.* 2, N. Danish Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary to the Court of Spain, arrived here last Week, and intends to fet out in a few Days for Paris, where he will remain till the Beginning of April, and then purfue his Journey to Madrīd.

Drefden, Feb. 10. The 17th past being the Anniverlary of their Polish Majesties Coronation, there was a fplendid Appearance of all the foreign Ministers and other Persons of Distinction at Court, to compliment their Majesties on that Occasion ; and at Night there was a Drawing Room in the Queen's Apartments. Colonel Franckenberg, who with feveral other Officers belonging to his Polifh Majefty's Troops, ferv'd as Volunteers in the Ruffian Army commanded by General

Munich, returned hither a few Days ago, and gave his Majesty a Detail of the Operations of the last Campaign, and was received very gracioufly. The 5000 Auxiliaries employed laft Campaign in Hungary, approach the Frontiers of Lufatia, which Part of the Electoral Dominions they are to enter on the 20th Inftant; and though they are not to perform a fecond Quarantain, (which it was intended they should,) not having had the least Symptoms of a peftilential Infection in their long March through Silefia, yet they will be kept there about a Fortnight or three Weeks to be reviewed by the Commillary.
