Naples, February 2, N. S. HE Magistrates of Commerce here have caufed an Edict to be publifhed, whereby the former Orders and Conffitutions relating to the Weight and Quality of Silk Manufactures are renewed, fo as to establish and encourage that Trade in this Kingdom. Several Country People of Trevico, in the Bafilicata, a Fief of the Marquels di Potenza, are arrived here, and have petitioned the King for the Redrefs of many Grievances and Injuffice offered to them by the Agents of the faid Mar-quefs, which the King has ordered to be enquired into and redreffed. Baron d'Eg-mond, Minister of the States General, has hired the Palace of the Duke di Satriano. On the 27th paft Sig. Piano, Superintendant of the Marine, Don Michael Reggio, General of the Gallies, and other Officers of the Marine, held a Conference by Directions of the King, to confult about a proper Expedient to fecure and enlarge our Mole, for the Benefit of Commerce. Sig. Ometrano, Engineer, is ordered by the King to make a Tour to vifit the Fortrefles of the Kingdom, and the Fortifications lately added to them; and two Regi-ments of Foot are posted at Fonti and Portello, on the Confines of the Ecclefiaftical State, where the King propoles to keep a Garrifon. The King has ordered M, Congiano, one of the Deputies of Commerce, to have filk Stuffs wove for fix Suits for the Service of their Majefties, in order to bring the Manufacture of this Country into Credit.

Rom, Feb. 6. Sig. Errigues, the Pope's Commiflary at St. Marino, has lately acquainted the Ministers of State, that he had assembled a Committee of the Members of the Republick, and had heard with great Attention the Representations and Sentiments of every fingular Person, but had found in the whole Republick only Eleven that were fatisfied with the Poffettion ta-ken by Cardinal Alberoni, the reft infifted for the Liberty of their Country, fo that Sig. Errigues defir'd fresh Instructions how to act, fince, for his own Part, he faw little or no Appearance of Success, any way but by Force, to make the Inhabitants fubmit to the Roman See. On the 6th Inflant, about Ten o'Clock in the Morning, the Pope, after a lingering Illness, expired, and in the Afternoon the Cardinal Hannibal Albani Camarlingo, attended by the Clerks of the Chamber, and the Pope's Guards, went, according to the ufual publick Formality, to examine the Cosple, in order to break the Ring from off his Finger. To-morrow his Corple is to be transported to St. Peter, in order to lye three Days in State, after which the Funeral will be performed. Circular Letters have been fent to the Cardinals abroad to invite them to the Conclave, into which the Cardinals will begin to enter on the 17th Inftant. Every Thing as yet has paired here with great Quiet.
