**T**HE Polish Emiffary, who was sent into Tartary to reclaim the Prisoners taken by the Cham's Troops in their last Incurfions into Poland againft the Ruffians, reports, that there is likely to be Troubles in the Crimea among the Tartars themfelves. Count Fleming, Great Master of the Artillery of Lithuania, had an Audience of Leave to Day of their Polish Majefties, and this Evening fet out on his Return to Lithuania, but is to go to the Court of Berlin in his Way. We have had exceffive cold Weather almoft four Months, the like never known in this Country before. The 25th Instant the Duke of Saxe-Weiffenfels arrived here, being invited by his Polish Majefty to partake of fome extraordinary Diversions with which the Carnival is to clofe.

*Vienna, Feb. 20.* On the 11th Instant a Courier arrived from Rome, with an Account, that Pope Clement XII. died on the 6th Instant. His Name was Laurence Corfini, descended of an ancient and illuftrious Family of Florence, of which Family was Andrew Corfini Bifhop of Fiefole, who died in 1373, and was canonized in 1629, by Urban VIII. There were alfo two Cardinals of the fame Family, the one named Peter Corfini, who died in 1405, the other Nereo Corfini, who died in 1678. The faid Laurence Corfini was born on the 17th of April 1652. On the 17th of May 1706, he was made a Cardinal by Clement XI. and upon the Death of Benedict XIII. was chofen Pope on the 12th of July 1730. Our Cardinal Archbishop Count Colonitz is on his Departure from hence for Rome, to affift in the Conclave which is to be held for chufing a new Pope; and an Expreff having been difpatch'd to Cardinal Sinzendorf at Brefflau, he is daily expected here on his Way to Rome upon the fame Occafion. The Seafon is very rigorous here, with frequent Snows and hard Frofts, fo that for feveral Weeks paff the Danube has been frozen over in this Neighbourhood; and by Means of the deep Snows the Streets of this City are hardly paffable.

*Whereat by an Act of Parliament paffed in the Eighth Year of the Reign of his prefent Majefty, for the Application of the Rents and Profits of the Eftates forfeited by the Attainder of James late Earl of Derwentwater, and Charles Radcliffe, it is enacted amongst other things, that the Commiffioners or Governors of His Majefty's Royal Hospital for Seamen at Greenwich, are to give fix Months previous Notice in the London Gazette, of the Time and Place, when and where fuch Eftates are intended to be Lett.
