N the 9th Instant, by Order of the King, an Edict was published here, by which the Jewish Nation is invited to come and fettle in these Parts for encreasing Traffick in the two Sililies and their Dependencies, with greater Privileges than have hitherto been allowed them in any other Parts of Italy. Treaties of Commerce are negociating with the Northern Nations, as well as at the Porte, and with

the Regencies of Barbary.

Rome, Feb. 20. On the 16th the College of Cardinals held a Congregation at the Vatican, at which the Cardinals Caraffa and Ruspoli were named and approved Conclavists, or Directors of the Conclave. The same Day the Venetian Ambassador went in a publick Manner to the faid Congregation, and made his Speech for the Election of the new Pope. Sig. d' Evora, the Portuguese Minister, made also his Speech to the said Congregation, the same Formality having here performed the Days before her beauty been performed the Days before by the other Ministers. On the 18th, Twenty Six Cardinals assisted at the High Mass of the Holy Ghost for the Election of the new Pope, after which they went processionally to the Palace at the Vatican, and (excepting some who are indispos'd) entered into the Conclave, where the foreign Ministers and the Roman

Nobility were to compliment them.

Leghorn, Feb. 26. They write from Genoa, that an Edict was lately published there by the Republick, commanding their Sub-jects to give up, disclaim and renounce, with-in the Space of three Months, the Passports and Colours of Foreign Princes under which they navigate their Vessels, and to annul the Contracts of the feign'd Sale of those Vessels; under Penalty of being condemned to the Gallies for five Years, and the Forfeiture of

their Estates.

Berlin, March 5. His Prussian Majesty has been much indisposed for some Days past, but since Tuesday last has sound a little Relief from the Medicines which the Doctors have ordered him. His Majesty shews an un-common Patience, appearing very calm and prepared for all Events.
