### Copenhagen, March 8.

N Order is iffued for the Reinforcement of the Army, by an Addition of 10 Men a Troop Cavalry, and eight Men a Company Infantry, to all the regular Regiments in Denmark ; except those of the Horse and Foot Guards, and the Regiment of Grenadiers. And it is faid the Guards and Grenadiers are foon to be augmented in like Manner. M. Bestuchef, the Czarina's Minister at this Court, has received a Letter of Notification for the King of Denmark, upon the Exchange of the Ratifications of the Treaty between Muscovy and the Porte. The late General Lewenoren having before his Death, ordered that his Funeral flould be without Pomp and very private, the King himfelf was pleafed to interpole, and in fome Meafure to alter thole Directions: Therefore in Conformity to his Majesty's Pleasure, the Corple, after having lain two or three Days in State, was interred here this Morning in the Church of our Lady, with Military Honours. The Enligns of Command as General, and the Order of the Elephant, were carried before by two Colonels in two Coaches with Six Horfes; twelve Majors supported the Pall; a great Gun was fired every Minute during the Proceffion, and the Regiment of the Prince Royal being drawn up in Pa-rade, made feveral Difcharges of Small Arms. The Hearfe was followed by four Coaches and Six; and in that which went next to it, M. Schulin accompanied the Son of the deceased, as a Chief Mourner.
