Petersbourg, Feb. 16. Both the Feldt Marshals, Munich and Lacy, arrived here the 13th Instant from the Ukraine, and were gracioufly received by the Czarina. On the 14th, the Peace with the Turks was published with the utmost Solemnity and Magnificence. Her Czarish Majesty made a present of a Gold Cup set with Diamonds, to the Duke of Courland, and conferr'd the Order of St. Catherine on his Dutchefs. Each of the Feldt Marshals had a Sword given them fet with Diamonds, and a confiderable Annuity for Life, befides their Salaries. Several red Ribbons of the Order of St. Alex-ander were difpofed of, and at the fame Time her Majesty made many other valuable Prefents to divers Perfons, and publish'd Acts of Grace and Indemnity, worthy fo great and generous a Princels. Last Night there was a grand Ball and Masquerade at Court, to which the English Merchants and their Wives were invited, and her Czarish Majesty was pleased to



to fee them dance Country Dances. For three Days all the City has been finely illu-For minated, and To-morrow, being the last Day of the Carnaval, there is to be another Ball and Masquerade at Court, and a costly Firework to be play'd off, which puts a Period to the Diversions.

Whitehall, March 18, 1739 40. Yefterday Mrs. Stephens received the Five Thou-fand Pounds Reward, affigned to her by an Act of Parliament on the Discovery of her Medicines for the Stone, and Proofs made of their Utility, Efficacy, and Diffolving Power. And the following Accounts re-lating thereto are published by Order of the Trustees named in the faid Act.

Mr. Gardiner took the Medicines about Eight Months, voided many Pieces of Stone in that Time, was freed from all his Symptoms, and being fearched again, first by Mr. Sharp, Sept. 14, 1739, and then on the 30th of November following by Mr. Nourfe, Mr. Chefelden, Mr. Sainthill, and Mr. Belcher, Surgeons, at Child's Coffee house in St. Paul's Church-yard, no Stone could be found.

2. Peter Appleton, of Black Fryars, aged 67, who 2. Peter Appleton, of Black Fryars, aged 07, who had the Symptoms of a Stone in the Bladder for more than Seven Years, with exceffive Pains for the Five laft Years of that Time. He was fearched July 6, 1739, by Mr. Sharp, and found to have a Stone in the Bladder, which Stone was also felt by Dr. Pellet, Dr. Nesbit, Dr. Whitaker, and Dr. Hartley, and judg'd by all prefent to be a large one. He took the Medicines for short Five Morths, during which Time Medicines for about Five Months, during which Time he voided a very large Quantity of Stone in Flakes and fmall Fragments. He grew quite free from all his Complaints, and was fearched again, first by Mr. Sharp, Nov. 9, and afterwards by Thirteen Phylicians and Surgeons, Nov. 30, at Child's Coffee-house in St. Paul's Church-yard, but no Stone could be found.

3. Henry Norris, of Leather-Lane, aged 55, who had the Symptoms of a Stone in the Bladder for about a Year and half. Aug. 17, 1739, he was fearched at St. George's Hofpital by feveral Phylicians and Surgeons, who all felt the Stone. He took the Medicines about four Months, and voided only a thick Sediment in that Time, however he was entirely freed from all his Symptoms ; and heing fearched again, Dee. 14, at St. George's Hospital, by Eight Phyficians and Surgeons, no Stone could be found.

. William Brighty, of Colchefter, aged 79, who had the Symptoms of a Stone in the Bladder for more than Three Years. He was fearched Sept. 8, 1739, at Guy's Hospital, by Dr. Gardiner and Mr. Sharp, and found to have a Stone. He took the Medicines for about Four Months, voided many Pieces of Stone. during that Time, became free from all his Symptoms, and being fearched again at Guy's Holpital, Jan. 19, 1739-40, by Dr. Gardiner, Mr. Sharp, and Mr. Belcher, no Stone could be found.

After these Persons and other Evidence had been produced, the following Certificate, being that which is required by the Act of Parliament, was figned by all the Truftees that were prefent at this Meeting, except Dr. Pellet and Dr. Nesbit, who having fome Doubts with Refpect to the Words Diffolving Power, chose to give the separate Certificates hereunto annex'd.
