An Act for providing a Marriage Portion for the Princess Mary.

An Act for the more effectual securing and encouraging the Trade of his Majesty's Bri-tish Subjects to America; and for the En-couragement of Seamen to enter into his Majesty's Service.

An Act for naturalizing fuch Foreign Protestants, and others therein mentioned, as are fettled or shall settle in any of his Majesty's Colonies in America.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and

their Quarters. An Act to explain and amend an Act made in the first Year of the Reign of her late Ma. jesty Queen Anne, intituled, An Act for the more effectual preventing the Abufes and Frauds of Perfons employed in the working up the Woollen, Linnen, Fustian, Cotton, and Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom; and for extending the said Act to the Manufactures of Leather.

An Act to indemnify Persons who have omitted to qualify themfelves for Offices and Employments within the Time limited by Law; and for allowing further Time for that Purpofe.

An Act for repairing the Road between Hockliffe in the County of Bedford, and Stony-Stratford in the County of Buckingham.

An Act for making more effectual three feveral Acts of Parliament, one of the fixth Year of the Reign of her late Majesty Queen
