I S Majefty came this Day to the Houfe of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, feated on the Throne with the ufual Solemnity, SirCharles Dalton, Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meflage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the Houfe of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to,

An Act for granting to bis Majefly the Sum of One Million out of the Sinking Fund for the Service of the Year 1740; and for enabling his Majefly to raife the further Sum of Two hundred thousand Pounds out of the growing Proluce of the said Fund; and for granting to his Majefly the Sum of Twenty one thousand Pounds one Shilling and eight Pence half Penny, remaining in the Receipt of his Majefly's Exchequer, arisen by Sale of Lands in the Island of Saint Christophers; and for the further appropriating the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament.

An Att for continuing the feveral Laws therein mentioned, relating to the Premiums upon the Importation of Masts, Yards, and Bowsprits, Tar, Pitch, and Turpentine; to British made Sail Cloth, and the Duties payable on Foreign Sail Cloth; to the Greenland and to the Whale Fishery; for granting a further Bounty for all Ships imployed in the Whale Fishery during the present War; for exempting Harponeers, and others imployed in the Greenland Fishery Trade from being impressed; and for giving further Time for the Payment of Duties omitted to be paid for the Indentures and Contracts of Clerks and Apprentices.

An Act for prohibiting Commerce with Spain.

An Act for amending and enforcing the Laws relating to Rogues, Vagabonds, and other idle and diforderly Perfons, and for reducing the fame into one Act of Parliament; and alfo for amending the Laws for erecting, providing and regulating Houfes of Correction.

An Ast to restrain and prevent the excessive Increase of Horse Races; and for amending an Ast made in the last Session of Parliament, intitled, An Ast for the more effectual preventing of excessive and deceitful Gaming.

An Ast for further and more effectually preventing the wilful and malicious Destruction of Collieries and Coal Works.

An Act to continue feveral Laws therein mentioned, for punishing fuch Persons as shall wilfully and maliciously pull down or destroy Turnpikes for repairing Highways, or Locks, or other Works erected by Authority of Parliament, for making Rivers navigable; for preventing Exactions of the Occupiers of Locks and Wears upon the River of Thames Westward, and for afcertaining the

Rates of Water Carriage upon the faid River; for preventing frivolous and vexatious Arrefts; and for better fecuring the lawful Trade of his Majefty's Subjects to and from the Eaft Indies, and for the more effectual preventing all his Majefty's Subjects trading thither under foreign Commilfions; and for limiting the Time for fueing forth Writs of Certiorari upon Proceedings before Juftices of the Peace, and for regulating the Time and Manner of applying for the Jame; for the better and more speedy Execution of Process within particular Franchiles or Liberties, and for extending the Powers and Authorities of Justices of the Yeace of Counties touching County Rates to the Justices of the Peace of fuch Liberties and Franchiles as have Commiljions of the Peace within them/elves.

An ASt for the Increase of Mariners and Seamen to navigate Merchant-ships and other trading Ships or Vessels.

An Act for more effectually preventing fraudulent Qualifications of Perfons to vote as Freeholders in the Election of Members to ferve in Parliament for fuch Cities and Towns as are Counties of themfelves in that Part of Great Britain called England.

An Ast for confirming and entirging the Powers granted by his Majefly to the Governors and Guardians of the Hespital for the Maintenance and Education of exposed and deferted young Children by his Majefly's mos gracious Charter, bearing Date the 19th Day of Ostober, in the Year of our Lord 1739, and to enable them to execute the good Purposes of the faid Charter.

An Act to give further Powers to the Commiffioners for building a Bridge crofs the River Thames from the City of Westminster to the opposite Shore in the County of Surry, and to enable them to raise a further Sum of Money towards finishing the faid Bridge, and to perform the other Truss reposed in them. An Act for the more effectual Maintenance

An Act for the more effectual Maintenance and well keeping of Staines Bridge and Egham Caufeway, being the Highway from London to the Wift Parts of England.

An Act for enlarging the Term and Powers granted and given by an Act passed in the Tenth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the First, institled, An Act for repairing the Road leading from Dunchurch in the County of Warwick, to the bottom of Mcriden Hill in the same County, and for making the said Act more effectual.

An Act for continuing and making more effectual an Act passed in the Fifth Year of the Reign of his late Majesty King George the First, for repairing the Roads from the Top of Stoken Church Hill to Enslow Bridge, and the Road from Wheatly Bridge through the City of Onford by Bedbrock to New Woodstock in the County of Oxford (except the Mile Way on each fide
