May it please your Majesty, THE Mayor, Jurats, Bailiffs and Burgesses of your Majesty's ancient Corporation of Queenborough, humbly beg your Majesty's Permission to approach your sacred Person with our Congratulations on the Espousals of her Royal Highness the Princess Mary with his Serene Highnels Prince Frederick of Hesle: A fignal Instance of your Majesty's Steadiness to support and defend the Protestant Interest in all Europe.

We have a grateful Sense of the Happiness flowing from the Wisdom of your Majesty's Councils and Administration, and of all the Blessings which a free People can hope to enjoy under a wise and gracious Prince.

Permit us, Royal Sir, to wish your Majesty a good Voyage cross the Seas, and a safe Return to these your Realms, which, we pray God, your Majesty may govern in Peace for many Years; and may there never be wanting one of your Royal Progeny to fit on the Throne, following your great Example in the Cause and Desence of Liberty.
