Their Excellencies the Lords Justices in
Council were this Day pleased to appoint
John Douglas of Hever, Esq; to be Sheriff of
the County of Kent, in the room of John
Smith of Lee, Esq; deceased.

Naples, May 31. Sig. Finochietti, who
was sent some Months ago to Constantino-
ple, has succeeded in his Negotiation, and
concluded a Treaty of Commerce between
the King of the two Sicilies and the Ottoman
Port, much on the same Foot as that which
subsisted when these Dominions were subject
to the Emperor. The two Officers of the
Limerick Regiment of Irish who murdered
their Colonel, having been tried by a Court-
Martial, were condemn'd, and beheaded last
Week in Presence of their own as well as
other Regiments, which were drawn up at
the Time of the Execution.

Legborne, June 10. On the 4th Instant
anchored in this Port his Britannick Majesty's
Ship the Argyle, Capt. Lingen Commander,
in seven Days from Port Mahon, convoying
to this Port several Merchant Ships, and two
Transports to take in Stores of Biscuits for
the Fleet. The same Evening sailed hence
his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Kennington,
Capt. Robinson Commander, to cruize off
Corfica. On the 8th the Prince de Beauveau
set out from Florence, to take on him the
Command of a Regiment lately given him
by the Great Duke of Tuscany.

Berlin, June 18. Wednesday the 22d In-
stant is fixed for the late King's Funeral at
Pozdam: The Foreign Ministers are all in-
vited to assist at the Ceremony. Count
Troughes sets out for Hanover two Days af-
ter the Funeral. This Morning M. Mun-
chausen had a private Audience of his Prussian
Majesty.

Hanover, June 22, N. S. This Day be-
ing the Anniversary of his Majesty's Succession
to the Crown of Great Britain, there was a
numerous and splendid Appearance at Heren-
hausen of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and
other Persons of Distinction, to compliment
His Majesty on that happy Occasion; and at
Night was a Play, at which the King
was present, and the Count, Envoy Extraor-
dinary from Prussia, and the Count Palatine of
Rhineland to the King

of Great Britain, who arrived here last Night
from England, waited this Day on his Ma-
jesty at Herenhausen, and was graciously re-
ceived.
