Copenhagen, July 2, N. S.

THE intended Augmentation of the Danish Forces (8 Men a Company in the Infantry, and 10 a Troop in the Cavalry) which was lately suspended, is again put forward by a new Order issued out about a Week ago, and the Officers are accordingly raising their necessary Recruits. The Court is expected here in eight or ten Days at farthest

Hanover, July 13. The King, who God be thanked, continues in perfect Health, came hither this Morning from Herenhausen to view the Apartments in the Castle; and at Noon his Majesty returned to Herenhausen. On the 9th Instant M. Adelebsen, President of the Council of the Court of Cassel, arrived here; and at the same time arrived M. Alt, Minister from the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Hesse. M. Guy Dickens, Secretary from the King of Great Britain to the King of Prussia, arrived here on the same Day from Berlin; as did also M. Kalbe, Councillor of the Chamber of Finances from the Court of Saxe-Gotha. On the 11th arrived here the Right Honourable the Earl of Holderness from Cassel; and Yesterday her Grace the Duchess of Dorset arrived from the same Place, whither she had accompanied her Royal Highness the Princess Mary from England.

Portsmouth, July 5.

Yesterday in the Afternoon his Royal Highness the Duke arrived here, and this Morning his Royal Highness went with the Right Honourable Sir John Norris, on board the Victory at Spithead, where he was received with the greatest Joy and Distinction imaginable.
