Hanover, July 13. The King, who God be thanked, continues in perfect Health, came hither this Morning from Herenhausen to view the Apartments in the Caffle ; and at Noon his Majefty returned to Herenhausen On the 9th Instant M. Adelebsen, President of the Council of the Court of Caffel, arrived here; and at the fame time arrived M. Alt, Minister from the King of Sweden as Landgrave of Heffe. M. Guy Dickens, Secretary from the King of Great Britain to the King of Pruffia, arrived here on the fame Day from Berlin; as did alfo M. Kalbe, Coun cellor of the Chamber of Finances from the Court of Saxe-Gotha. On the 11th arrived here the Right Honourable the Earl of Holdernels from Caffel ; and Yefterday her Grace the Dutchels of Dorlet arrived from the fame Place, whither fhe had accompanied her Royal Highnels the Princels Mary from England.
