Copenhagen, July 22. HE Queen of Denmark fince her Return hither, has made a Prefent to the Prince of Wirtemberg-Oels of a very fine Snuff-box fet with Diamonds. The Slefwick, a Ship belonging to the Danifh East India Company, arrived here on the 15th from China : She left Canton on the 7th of January, and touched at St. Helena. Yefterday M. Cogorani the Spa-nifh Envoy had his firft Audience of their Danish Majefies at Fridericksbourg; to which Place the Court removed on the 19th Inftant for the Remainder of the Summer.

Hambourg, July 27. M. Berkentin, who has refided for many Years at the Imperial Court as Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Denmark, arrived here last Saturday from Vienna, and set out Yesterday for Copenhagen.

Hanover, Aug. 5, N. S. His Majefty has been pleafed to appoint Melchior Guy Dick-ens, Efq; late his Secretary to the Court of Berlin, and who came hither fome time ago to pay his Duty to the King, to be his Majefty's Minister at the said Court, and Yesterday he kiss'd his Majesty's Hand ; and having had his Audience of Leave of the King, fet out this Evening on his Return to Berlin. The King has been pleafed to grant the Place and Dignity of Dean of the Cathedral Church of Peterborough, void by the Death of Dr. Francis Lockier late Dean thereof, unto the Reverend Dr. John Thomas, one of his Majefty's Chaplains in Ordinary, and now attending his Majefty here.
