N the 12th Inftant in the Afternoon, the Princefs Anne, Dutchefs of Brunfwick-Lunebourg, her Czarith Majefty's Niece, was happily deli-vered of a Prince. On the 18th the young Prince was chriftened privately, that is, Perfons only of a certain Rank were admitted into her Czarish Majesty's Dreffing Room, where the Ceremony was performed. The Czarina named hun Iwan, that is, John, and was his Godmother. Upon this Occasion feveral Officers of the Guards were advanced to a fureror Rank; and M. Bestuchef, who lately came from Denmark, was declared Cabinet-Minister. The Day before, which was Sunday the 17th, and the Prince of Brunf wick's Birth-day, Te Deum was lung in the Charch of the Citadel for the Birth of the young Prince, and the Cannon of the Fortrefs were fired; and the young Prince is ordered to be prayed for in all the Churches.
