A PROCLAMATION,

For a General Fast.

GEORGE R.

WHereas we have found ourfelves obliged, VV for vindicating the Honour of our Crown, fecuring the Trade and Navigation of our Subjects, and defending our undoubted Rights, to declare War against the King of Spain, and are determined to profecute the fame with the utmost Vigour, till, by the Bleffing of God on our Arms, we shall obtain that Satisfaction and Security which we may hope from the Justice of our Caufe; We therefore, putting our Truft in the divine Affiftance, have refolved, and do, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, hereby Command, that a publick Fast and Humiliation be observed throughout that Part of our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, upon Wednelday the Fourth Day of February next, that fo both we and our People may humble ourfelves before Almighty God, in order to obtain Pardon for our Sins; and may, in the most devout and fo-lemn Manner, fend our Prayers and Supplications to the divine Majefty, for averting those heavy Judgments, which our manifold Sins and Provocations have most justly de-ferved, and imploring his Bleffing and Af-fistance on our Arms, and for restoring and perpetuating Peace, Safety and Profperity to us and our Kingdoms. And we do ftrictly charge and command, that the faid pub-lick Faft be reverently and devoutly ob-ferved by all our loving Subjects in Scot-land, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid his Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Pu-nifhment as we may juftly inflict on all fuch as contemn and neglect the Performance of fo Religious and Necessary a Duty. Our Will is therefore, and we charge, that incontinent this our Proclamation feen, ye pass to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there, in Our Name and Authority, make Publication hereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, That Our Solicitor do caule printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs of the feveral Shires, Stewards of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom we ordain to fee the fame published : And we appoint them to fend Doubles hereof to the feveral Paroch Kirks within their Bounds, that up-on the Lord's-Day immediately preceding the Day above-mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.

A PROCLAMATION,

For Encouraging Seamen and able-bodied Landmen to enter themselves on board our Ships of War.

GEORGE R.

WHereas it is our Royal Intention to give due Encouragement to all fuch Seamen and able-bodied Landmen who shall voluntarily enter themselves in our Service, We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy Council, to publish this our Royal Proclamation; and we do hereby promife and declare, that all fuch Seamen not above the Age of Fifty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years, fit for our Service, or able-bodied Landmen from Eighteen to Thirty Years of Age, who fhall in Great Britain, Ireland, or the Iflands of Guernfey or Jerfey, on or before the Fifteenth Day of February next, voluntarily enter themselves to serve in our Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of our Ships, or the chief Officers on board fuch Tenders as shall be employed for raifing Men for the Service of our Navy, or with any Juffice of Peace or chief Magi-ftrate of any City or Town, fhall refpective-ly receive as our Royal Bounty, the refpective Sums following, (that is to fay) Every able Seaman the Sum of Two Guineas, every ordinary Seaman the Sum of 'Thirty Shillings, and every able bodied Landman the Sum of Twenty Shillings each Man; fuch re'pective Sums to be paid them by the Clerks of the Check, or by the Treasurer of our Navy, in Manner following, (that is to fay) If the Ships they enter into fit out in the Rivers of Thames or Medway, so soon as they get to the Nore; and if the faid Ships fit out at Portlinouth, fo foon as they go out to Spithead; and if the faid Ships fit out at Plymouth, before they fail from Hamoaze; and if the faid Ships fit out at any other Ports, fo foon as they shall arrive at the Nore, or at Spithead, or in Ply-mouth Sound. And we do hereby require and direct, that if any such Seaman or Landman shall voluntarily enter themselves within the Time beforementioned, with any Officer, Juffice of Peace, or chief Magistrate as aforefaid, fuch Officer, Justice of Peace, or chief Magistrate respectively, shall give to each Man so entring, a Certificate under his Hand and Seal (without Fee or Reward) of his Entry, and the Time of fuch Entry, and shall thereby limit such Number of Days, not exceeding Ten, as may be necellary for his re-pairing on board, and in which Certificates they
