*Naples, January 10, N. S.*

ON the 5th and 7th Instant arrived here a Train of Field-pieces, and twenty Waggons with Ammunition and Military Stores, which were left at Capua by the Spaniards when they took that Place, and are now put into our Arsenal. The Preparations for War are continued here with the utmost Diligence, and all the Ship-Carpenters and Smiths are constantly employed in making new Carriages for the Service of the Artillery.

*Rome, Jan. 14* On the 8th a German Officer arrived here with Dispatches from the Governour of Milan to M. Tun, the Imperial Minister, who had immediately an Audience of the Pope, to demand the Passage of a Detachment of 6000 Germans from the Milanese to Tuscany through the Ecclesiastical State; and though 'tis said the Pope neither granted nor denied the Request, we have an Account, that the Inhabitants of the Bolognese are preparing the necessary Quarters for those Troops.

*Leghorne, Jan. 20.* On the 17th three Troops of the Regiment of Perling Cuirassiers, and two Companies of Grenadiers, set out from Pisa in their March to Siena. On the 19th they were followed by a Battallion of Hilburgausen's Regiment of Foot from Pisa; and on the 20th a Battallion of Pallavicini's Regiment marched from hence to join the other Austrian Troops at Siena.

*Florence, Jan. 22.* On the 18th M. de Wachtendonck arrived here from Leghorne, attended by M. Salvioni from Massa, (an Agent employed by the Germans in the late War to provide the Magazines): He had immediately a Conference with the Prince Craon and M. Richecourt, and has held several Councils of War, in order to settle the necessary Supplies for the Subsistence of the 6000 Germans that are coming from Lombardy to Tuscany.

*Vienna, Jan. 25, N. S.* The youngest Archdutchess was taken ill about Two of the Clock this Morning, and died at Noon, much in the same Manner and with the same Symptoms as the Queen's eldest Daughter died in June last. This Affliction comes very hard upon the Queen, who is near her Time of Lying-in.

*Berlin, Feb. 7.* His Prussian Majesty is expected here this Evening from Rupin. M. Demeradt, the Queen of Hungary's Resident, left this Place on Thursday last.
