Petersboarg, January 17.

HE Corple of the late Czarina, after having been exposed in the Church of the Citadel under a Canopy, was at last deposited in the Earth the 15th Instant. This being the Festival of St. Anthony, whose Name the Prince Generalissimo bears, there was a very splendid Appearance at Court, and all the Foreign Ministers were invited on this Occasion to dine with the Prime Minister. The King of Poland has conferred the Order of the White Eagle on young Count Munich, and on the President Mengden, the Prime Minister's Son and Nephew; which Count Lynar brought, and they were invested with it Yesterday. The Great Dutchess has also conferred the Russian Order of St. Andrew on M. de Bruhl, Master of the Horse to his Polish Majesty, and Brother to his Majesty's Cabinet Minister, which Colonel Neubour, who is to fet out in a few Days for Dresden, will carry with him.

Berlin, Feb. 11. It is said his Prussian Majesty intends to set out on his Return to his Army in Silesia the 18th of this Month, which Army will consist of about 40,000 Men, when the Regiments now on their March have joined the Forces there. To-morrow General Glasenap's Regiment sets out from hence for that Province, Kalkenstein's on Tuesday, Prince Leopold's on Thursday, and the Gens d'Arms, and Troop of Lise-Guards lately formed, on Saturday next. A new Train of 30 Battering Cannon and 16 Mortar Pieces has been taken out of the Arsenal, and is sorthwith to be sent by Water thither.
