**P**RINCE Augustus of Holstein having accompanied his Brother the Bishop of Lubeck to this City, returned Yesterday to Kiel. His Highness will come back to this Place towards the Beginning of next Month, and then set out for Holland, from whence he will proceed to Ypres, where his Regiment in the Dutch Service is in Garrison.

Berlin, Feb. 11. His Prussian Majesty has been pleased to appoint M. Borck, late his Minister at Vienna, to be a Minister of State in the Department for Foreign Affairs, in the Room of M. Thulemeyer, deceased. The last Letters from Silesia say, that the Castle of Namslaw, situate on the Frontiers of Poland, had surrendered, and that the Prussians found there a Magazine of Provisions and Ammunition, and took between two and three Hundred Prisoners. Baron Gotter and M. Cocceii were named Yesterday to go to Franckfort, as his Prussian Majesty's Ambassadors for the Election of a new Emperor.
